2. National Competitions

More and more NF organise their own National Championships. This situation is drastically different from 4 years ago. The development of a national activity is the proof of a growing interest for CSL canoeing. In some countries, ICF CSL committee is still involved as technical support for the organisation.

More and more judges are taught about Slalom judging and also YOG format. A wide range of countries among the nationalities of judges is a key-point for the organisation of continental events.

In the meantime, ICF CSL committee is requested the different NFs under the development program for several years to invite neighbouring countries in order to pump up the regional Slalom activity.

These countries act as "foster" countries. Thanks to their quick development, they play the role of booster for regional Slalom activity by supporting and helping the closest countries.

B. Development and educational program

1. Development, coaching, technical officers

For all camps, a time is dedicated to the teaching of coaching in Slalom. It aims current competitors and also national coaches to come along with their team. Therefore the actions are done before the organisation of a competition. The technical knowledge is adjusted to the targeted people (Olympic or YOG format, level of the participants)

To go one step further, the committee is **sending moulds of K1/C1** to countries able to start a local fiberglass production: Mexico, Nigeria.

To be noticed the paddle equipment support given by the company BRACSA to the TIP world paddlers level.

D. Development and High Performances

On the whole **5 continents**, **36 countries and 54 athletes** (with significant results) attended the different camps from development level to TIP.

A constant regularity from the athletes is noticeable: only 5% have done one action under the ICF CSL development program, 95% have attended more than 1 action.

The system of classification for the supporting and growing performances in competition under the CSL development program is articulated about:

1. Continental level

Paddlers are invited for continental camps with a regional or continental event (could be combined with TIP camp). Then, according their level and the will to practice and develop their trainings conditions in their own location, they could be invited to actions on world level.

The actions are regional continental camps and continental camps during the off-season and/or continental events.

2. World level

It is made about the TIP (below 21 years old) and the Non-TIP (older than 21 or not Olympic class).

The World-TIPs are selected among the best Continental-TIPs on continental events

The Non-TIPs are selected according their ICF ranking and the investment they show for development of Slalom in their country (athlete role model).

The actions are mainly Summer Tour, World championships camps, C1 Women camps

3. Olympic level

2012 was the end of 3 years working under the current TIP group shape. 5 paddlers Olympian were under the TIP over the last 3 years. They joined TIP continental and world camps.





1. Continents and participation at the CSL Development program




2. Average age per continent. Global average age: 20,1 years old



3. Progression by class on the ICF World Ranking from 2010 to 2012



Africa

On the very stage of Development. It is needed to boost and dynamism the regional activity by regular competitions coupled with training camps. Participation at Continental events is not enough to reach the proper world level or TIP level.

Asia

Regularity and sustainability. Reinforcement of high level competition by more training camps for the best Asian paddlers (except China and Japan). Support to get longer trainings in Europe for TIP and World level.

America

World and Olympic level is the same paddler. More paddlers to attend the world camps.

To be noticed in South America: few following in the paddlers sent to actions. More sustainability is a key-point for a better growing toward TORONTO 2014.


Europe

Due to strong background in Slalom, European paddlers are matching good performances.


Oceania

6. Spreading of the budget among the different participating continents (per %)




G. Development and gender equity

In the frame of the ICF CSL development program, an attention is strongly given to C1W activity since 2010 (Junior Worlds). Since this time, yearly C1W camps are organized (Worlds, World Cups, Continental Championships).

Good results are noticed since 2011 Worlds: several finals from Development countries side and a silver medal for the Viktoriia Dobrotvorska from UKR at the Europeans U23 Championships 2012.

During the different camps, more female coaches were calling for coaching the paddlers from development actions or TIP actions. On the right side, the % of woman coaches in the coach's crew from 2010 to 2012

Beside that, we still notice a low participation for K1W canoeing in the different actions. A stronger collaboration work between Continental Confederations and National federations by developing specific programs for Women in Canoeing is a must and is fitting in the frame of the development program run by the ICF.

H. Para-canoeing Slalom

No activity within the ICF CSL development programme yet at this stage. Few National Federations are starting to implement a national programme. A special attention has to be paid to the safety of the Para canoeing athletes in white water

I. Suggestions

1. Regarding TIP and World Level

The continuous improvement of each class brought 5 selected for the Games. They are willing to paddle until RIO 2016. They cannot fit anymore with the TIP profile, but they still need a support from ICF.

On the other hand, they should attend continental events as athlete role model and give help for the coaching of the Youngers.

As the different training camps are more and more popular, more paddlers attend them. Therefore, to keep up the quality of the work, the ICF has to accept to pay decently the different ICF coaches, especially for all actions on continental level.

2. Regarding cooperation with Continental Associations

A clear schedule and plan must be done with the dates of the main continental competitions

A clear financial support to the "continental coach" participation (mostly flight expenses)

A clear survey of the level of the different countries and the improvement to be done for the main continental targets (TORONTO 2015, BOTSWANA 2014, ASIAN GAMES 2014...)

3. Regarding Regional activity (sub-continental)

In the same way as "sharing" national championships, several countries in one "foster" country should share some training camps. Funding's could be found to the local NOC if it is presented as an action of an Olympic discipline with regional emphasis.

4. Regarding equipment program

ICF CSL committee has to support the expenses to send an expert in boats construction to teach the different manufacturers the process to build a Slalom boat thanks to the sent moulds.

5. Regarding women slalom activity

Some actions have to be organised for women only as C1W camps by inviting C1W and K1W. Then a promoting of doubling activity could be done.

Beside that, groundwork in the different continents must be done with the strongest support each Continental association can give.

A key for the ICF Canoeing development is to use and support private initiatives. It must be a regular cooperation with different "foundations" leading training and education programme (e.g. Amadonsa, Nepal River Girls). It has to be a partnership among Women commission and CSL committee

6. Regarding Para-canoeing

The YOG format could fit perfectly with the development of CSL activity in the Para-canoeing area. CSL has to explore this possibility as it reduces the impact of white water safety concern and still develop the fundamental of the activity.
