# CSL Development October 2012 - October 2014

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# Abbreviations

- YOG= Youth Olympic Games
- TIP= Talent Identification Program

Over the last 2 years, a dramatic improvement has been seen among the group of TIP paddlers on both World and Continental level. This is reflecting the interest from paddlers for increasing their skills and their will to perform on higher level.

As a matter of fact, this is only the visible part of the underground work undertaken since 2012. This outcome is mainly based on the development guidelines that were given in 2010 (beginning of the TIP Slalom) and in 2012 after the debriefing and conclusions following the Olympic Games London 2012.

The major points we went through are:

- Establishment of the Continental coach position. By working in coordination with the ICF development program coordinator, training camps aiming competition and development of the activity gave incentive and following of the involvement and work on a smaller scale than the world one. It's come as a more accurate tool to push and follow the involvement of NFs
- Pursuance and sustainability of the participation:
- For athletes under TIP by an "agreement" of 2 years registrations
- For coaches working with the TIP groups on continental and world level. It has brought a
  double effect as athletes identify a referent for their race preparation and officials do the same
  on the organization field.
- The growing of programs dedicated to women activity with C1W support on a competition level and Expand & Extend on the development level.
- Introduction and strong support given to the YOG Slalom format on a regional level. This is a key point that should be generalized to support and promote sub-continental actions and competitions

We still have fields to grow and reinforce from now to 2020, with as milestones 2016 OG Rio and the different continental championships, 2018 YOG Buenos Aires and the different continental games/event.

- Beside the reinforcement of the "foster countries" concept, the participation of TIPs athletes to the global development program is to become a must.
- The continental activity has to be carried in a stronger way by the Continental Association through the Continental Activity budgets they are given by ICF and the knowledge brought by the Continental coaches. The frame of the camps could easily be a copy/paste of TIP continental/world shape.
- A particular attention has to be given to implement the continental training center and continental training camps out of the frame of competition time, the reinforcement of the local manufacturing program by the support given to share the knowledge of building equipments rather than providing equipments.
- Last but not least, we have to insure that yearly national championships with true and relevant participation are organized especially in the countries to attend the World Championships.







#### 2. <u>Registered countries, gender repartition</u>

In 2014, the sharing of registrations is more balanced among America, Asia, Europe than in 2013. To be noticed that some countries sent registrations but could not attend the different actions because of National Schedule targeting Continental Games or because of funding.



With an increase of 8% in registrations, we could keep the same sharing among female and male. The average age is still about 18 years old.

#### 3. Participation at the TIP actions (Continental + World)

e.g.: through the different continental championships/camps, the number of days spent by American paddlers is 20% of the total days spent on continental actions.

The difference between Africa and [America, Asia, Europe] is due to yearly TIP camps or Continental Championships held in the group of 3 continents.

The Continental activity in Africa has to be reinforced by a stronger Slalom competition plan lead by CAC. It would be useful to use the YOG format (CSP + CSL) to launch activity on the younger ones and to bring them incentive to the competition.

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

### 4. Details TIP Continental (TIP 2)

This is fed thanks to the Development camps. It concerns the best athletes from each continent (appointed by the NFs).

Athletes under TIP Continental are automatically eligible to TIP Continental training camps (season preparation camps or/and race preparation camps). The following graphs concern the period October 2012 – October 2014




## 5. Details TIP World (TIP 1)

The World-TIPs are selected among the best Continental-TIPs on continental events. For any World camp, one athlete per registered country is invited and preference, on World Level, is given to athlete with already a TIP Slalom experience.

By this policy, we can see a dramatic improvement of

- The abilities of paddlers in their level
- The involvement in the competition process and the duties of any competitor and member of a group
- A "TIP spirit" is born as we have a good following of our actions through the successive seasons
- For one athlete registered, we heard oftenly that some others (youngers) from the same are "waiting their turn". We experienced at each World camp the gathering of athletes coming on their own expenses and sharing the trainings with their country/continent mates.
- Sustainability thanks to the following up in the selection & invitation of athletes
- The balance female/male is better among the camps than for registrations. This is an effect of chosen invitations and strong pushing to invite girls in priority





In the table below, we can read a better spreading among the continents and countries represented. The number of countries reached in 2011, year of the global Olympic selection, is almost reached on a "normal" year of Worlds Seniors.

We have increase increase of 36% the participation in terms of countries at the U23/Junior worlds since 2010.

To be noticed that in 2013 and 2014, most of U23 and some Juniors attended both Worlds U23/Juniors and Worlds Seniors. This is to be kept. Outcomes are benefit for them (stronger experience), for us (better reading of the close future), for the TIP group (better sustainability)

#### 6. Sustainability and heritage of the Slalom Development program

"Ex-TIP" or "Ex-Development" athletes are now taking responsabilities in the organization and management of the ICF camps or on a national development of canoe Slalom.

TIP Slalom project is getting now in its second layer after 6 years from now with the involvement of current TIPs in development projects. See the power-point "TIPs ' n' Spire".

### C. Expand & Extend: Women and Canoeing

This project proposed at the Congress 2012 was launched in 2 countries in 2013 Asia with Nepal and Africa with Togo. In 2014 in Turkey for Europe is hosting a camp. Togo, Nepal are again planed. Opportunity of extension to Oceania and America is doable soon.

#### D. Summary of actions


From October 2012 to October 2014, figures are speaking in favor of the Slalom canoe development policy we carry on:


- A total of 36 actions in 24 months
- Over the 5 continents, 22 countries hosted actions, more than 40 countries participated and got benefit of actions
- 492 participations for 4 995 days of activity....

The spreading among continents to welcome development actions (except no TIP actions) shows the balance among the 3 targeted continents. The little advance in Asia is mainly an effect of some development programs organized by NFs that reached the 2nd level on the scale of development program (period based on 2 olympic periods)




