ENTRY SITUATION

The deadline for the numerical entries has now passed and it shows that we have the required number of countries (min. 6) in all races but one: **C2 Men Junior**. Of course, we do not know the exact entry situation until we have the nominal entries by 22 August midnight and any race needs to have the required 6 countries to be run.

In the C2 Men Junior we have entries from ESP, HUN, JPN, and POR.

We have numerical entries in the C1 Men Junior from CZE, FRA, GBR, GER, ITA, and POL and we hope that some of those nations will add their entry in the C2 category, so that we have a World Championships in this as well.

POINTS ALLOCATION AND WORLD RANKING

Points towards the overall result will be awarded in the four classes, according to the table below.

The allocation of points leads to the World Ranking with World Championships 2019 as the Grand Final where the winners of each of the 4 classes will receive an ICF Trophy.

Where points in the series are equal, the paddler who has won the larger number of races will be the winner. In case that still being a tie, the most second places will be taken into account, and so on to third and fourth positions, until the position is determined.

In the event that all places are equal, the winner will be determined by position of the most recent races completed, i.e. last event has highest priority.
