



Report of the TIP Training Camp preceding the Junior and U23 World Championships in Bratislava (SVK) July 10th - 23rd 2017

A. <u>Accommodation, venue and participants</u>

ICF development training camp took place in Bratislava, Slovakia. Accommodation, breakfast, lunch and dinner were made 3min walking distance from the venue, in a boat house. Hosts were friendly, helpful and always trying to make things easier and better for the athletes.

The group was made of 15 athletes as 6 girls and 9 boys from 15 different countries (average age 18). Plus, we welcomed on our training sessions three others paddlers from Morocco, Malaysia and Mauritius Island, mainly because they were on their own. Noteworthy point: it was the first time that a paddler from Mauritius Island competed at the World Championships.

The group was split in 4 parts :

- Miroslav Damborsky : (THA), (IND), (NOR), (MAS)
- Rafal Polaczyk : (NEP), (SEN), (GRE), (TPE)
- Jakub Stanovsky : (FYR), (HUN), (MAR), (CHI)
- Mathys Huvelin and Sherry Wei-Han Chen (assistant coach) : (FIN), (MEX), (UKR)

Some athletes started kayaking less than one year ago only on flat water, it was a big challenge for them to paddle down Cunovo's channel but they made it without any complications.

Athletes were able to paddle twice a day, almost every day, on the course. We found the right balance between : '*training*' to discover/learn the course and '*rest*' to perform at the World Championships.

B. <u>Coaching and equipment</u>

Equipment was made of personal boats for almost all the paddlers, except for Jahanvi

Shrivatsava (IND) who borrowed a boat from the local club, thanks to Zorka. Without this help, the quality of the work would not reach the targets.

We noticed that it is always important to have a local referent with the TIP group, Miroslav Damborsky from Slovakia, was our guide during this camp.

Sherry Wei-Han Chen from Chinese Taipei was part of the TIP group as an athlete the last few years, and now she is on a transition to become a coach. That's why, she cooperated with Mathys Huvelin as an assistant coach to learn the job. She learned a lot, and now she is confident and competent enough to give advices to the athletes.

We worked in cooperation with Josepha Longa, Chinese Taipei team leader, and Nicolas Noël,



team leader of Thailand during our sessions before the competition, as we were on the same training slots. We managed to do a good work.
