CANOE MARATHON NEW NATION TALENT IDENTIFICATION PROGRAMME (TIP) 2018

In the framework of the ICF Development Programme the so-called Talent Identification Program.me will be organized for Canoe Marathon discipline for canoe and kayak paddlers in 2018.

The principal target of the TIP is to identify and promote talented athletes in canoe marathon who has potential for further improvement and without the ICF/POR canoe federation' financial support wouldn't be able participate in the World Championships.

The programme will be held in connection with the Marathon World Championships in Prado Vila Verde, Portugal 6-9 September 2018 and will include a training camp for approximately 1 week before the competition.

The project provides priority for the men and women kayakers and canoe paddlers from countries, which are new to Marathon or have not taken part in a Marathon World Championships before!

This means that in case there are available places then for example countries new to marathon in canoes could be considered.

The Programme:

The invited athletes will participation in Training Camp and in the U23 or Senior World Championships in Prado Vila Verde Portugal on 6-9 Sept with a coaches' assistance. (Please note: Juniors will only be considered if they can be accompanied by another adult TIP applicant or an accompanying adult fully funded by the paddlers National Federation)

Application to the Programme.

Application can be sent on the enclosed form by the national federations which have not entered the ICF Marathon World Championships before other than through a previous TIP programme.

- The age limit of the athletes is 15 to 23 of years. (Birth years are:1996-2003)

Application and any queries shall be sent to Tim Cornish at the e-mail address of cornisht@mweb.co.za before 30th June 2018.

The camp will be limited to approximately 10 athletes so please apply early to be sure of being accepted.

Athletes might be invited continuously to the TIP in the coming years in consideration with their progress and cooperation with organization, coaches, team members and officials.

The applicant national federations will receive the decision of invitation to the programme before 15th July 2018

Financial conditions:

- Expenses (including accommodation, internal transport, boat rental and accreditation fee will be covered or arranged by the POR Host Organisation.
- The traveling to Portugal and back to origin city including any visa costs must be paid by the participants National Federation.

This invitation has been sent to National Federations, so please check with your national federation if this is of interest for you.

INFORMATION ABOUT THE WORLD SERIES 2018-19 INCLUDING APPLICATION DEADLINE

Below you will find the regulations for the WORLD SERIES 2018-19.

Race organisers who wish to be part of the 2018-19 series must contact member of the ICF Canoe marathon Committee, Begona Rodriguez soonest possible and no late than 1st August 2018 – email: begona.rodriguez@canoeicf.com declaring their interest to apply. They will then receive application form and further information about the decision process.

REGULATIONS

RACES FOR THE WORLD SERIES

The ICF Canoe Marathon World Series consist of Canoe Marathon races selected by the Canoe Marathon Committee which races together with the World Cups and the World Championships form the World Series. The World Series starts with the first race in the series after the World Championships and ends with the following World Championships.

Races subject for being part of the World Series must be organised by clubs or organisations of a National Federation member of the ICF. These races will be part of the ICF Calendar and the race name must include "being part of the ICF World Series".

These races must be held according to the ICF Competition Rules, and an ICF international canoe marathon technical official will be appointed to supervise the competition.

THE WORLD SERIES CLASSES AND COMPETITORS

The World Series classes are:

- K1 Men
- K1 Women
- C1 Men
- C1 Women

The World Series is open to all athletes who are members of clubs under a National Federation affiliated to the ICF. Individual race entries can be submitted directly to the race organizer according to the ICF rules, except for the World Cup and World Championships where entries are to be made by National Federations. A class is established if there is a minimum of 6 entries in that class.

INVITATION

Must be in English as a minimum and must give information of participation conditions according to the ICF Competition Rules, money prize size, communication information/website.

MONEY PRIZES

To be approved for the World Series a race must have money prizes for minimum the first 3 positions in the World Series classes. World Cups and World Championships are exceptions to this requirement, but some World Cups may have.

The money prizes must be minimum 1,000 Euro per class (e.g. 500, 300, 200 for first, second and third).

PROMOTION AND RESULTS

World Series races should be promoted in English on social media and on the ICF website. This should include photos, videos and immediate results to the internet.

Results of races must be in accordance with the ICF Canoe Marathon requirements using excel format. Template will be provided by the ICF Canoe Marathon Committee.

POINTS ALLOCATION AND WORLD RANKING

Points towards the overall result will be awarded in the four classes, according to the table below.

The allocation of points leads to the World Ranking with World Championships 2019 as the Grand Final where the winners of each of the 4 classes will receive an ICF Trophy.

Where points in the series are equal, the paddler who has won the larger number of races will be the winner. In case that still being a tie, the most second places will be taken into account, and so on to third and fourth positions, until the position is determined. In the event that all places are equal, the winner will be determined by position of the most recent races completed, i.e. last event has highest priority.
