WORLD RANKING 2017/18 WINNERS

The World Series Races, the World Cups and the World Championships are combined into a World Series for K1 Men and Women, C1 Men and Women, with a point system leading to the World Ranking with World Championships as the final event where the winners of each of the 4 classes receive an ICF Trophy.

ICF CONGRESS 2018 AND RULE CHANGES

The XXXVII ICF Ordinary Congress will be held on 23-24 November 2018 in Budapest, Hungary where the delegates will deal with proposals for changing the ICF Rules.

These are the current changes for Canoe Marathon:

The ICF Board of Directors has already **approved changes to Technical Rules**:

9 ITOs and 10 Duties of officials - Addition to existing text

The Deputy Chief Official will closely co-operate with the Chief Official and the Competition Manager and will handle the administrative tasks of the competition. He will collect the notes from the Team Leaders of the participating countries on the changes before the beginning of the Team Leader's meeting and put them in order according to the races.

At the meeting, he/she will record all changes announced by the Chief Official in this own programme. If necessary, he/she will check the personal identification documents of the competitors and their age. He will collect the forms necessary for the administration and any other means necessary for the secretariat. In case of computer data processing, he/she will keep in contact with the responsible IT person. During the competition he/she will check the results race by race. He/she will formulate the decisions of the Competition Committee passed in the subject-matter of the protest and will arrange to have it recorded in the minutes. He/she is responsible for the accuracy of the minutes.

28 Finish – Clarification of the rule (wording amendment)

Competitors who have been lapped will end their race at the most suitable time and location and as soon as possible after the race leader has passed the last portage. The normal location for ending a lapped paddlers race will be at the portage. They will be recorded in the position they are placed at that point in the race. This rule applies to World Championships and World Cups.

For Congress decision two proposals for changes to the General Rules have been put forward. They are both supported by the ICF Board of Directors:

Rule 34 Arrangements (General rule)

<u>Adding Short Distance</u> to the World Championships programme for Men and Women K1, and Men and Women C1.

Rule 36 The Course – (Technical rule)

Short Distance:

Distance: 3 laps and 2 portages of a course with a portage producing a total distance of appr. 3.4km with an approximate distance of appr. 500m between the turns. The first portage is after appr. 1 km. The distance may vary due to circumstances at the course.

Rule 34 Arrangements (General rule)

Allowing World Championships for Masters on the condition that entries can be made on an individual basis and not on NF basis:

A valid World Championships is held only if at least six (6) boats from at least four (4) federations start in the event and there must be at least three (3) Continents starting in the overall competition.

Championships are restricted to the following classes:

Men K1, C1, K2, C2, K2 all age groups (competitors in doubles from same country) Women: K1, C1, K2, C2, K2 all age groups (competitors in doubles from same country)

Rule 36 The Course (Technical rule)

Recommended course for masters:

Masters men in kayaks in their 64th year and younger will race 5 laps of the course for the normal distance World Championships events.

Masters Women and all Canoe classes in their 64th year and younger will race 4 laps.

Masters in their 65th year and older will race one lap less than the younger masters and will not be required to do portages.
