These 3 World, Continental and national Events will be held in 2 waiting days: Friday *June 7th and Saturday June 8, 2019*.

The date, June 1st, has been changed 'cause of sports calendar conflict with one of the biggest Va'a around the Island of Tahiti in 3 legs.

The Leeward Islands are with Tahiti, Moorea and Tetiaroa part of the Society Islands.

Huahine used to be called Matairea,

LOCATION

A TROPICAL CLIMATE

The French Polynesian islands enjoy a tropical climate; the maximum numbers of hours of sunshine is close to 3000 per year in the Tuamotu Atols, one of the highest in the world!

The temperature which is relatively constant, is cooled by the trade winds of the Pacific that blow throughout the year,

The average ambient temperature is 27°C, and the waters of the lagoons area fairly constant 26°C. While further away from the equator, the archipelagos down south (the Austral and Gambier), enjoy cooler temperatures.
