As per the ICF rules for slalom, all competitors will have 1 qualification run with the usual ICF progression to semi finals. The remainder of the field will have a second qualification run and this result will determine the final athletes who will progress to the semi- finals.

Progression to the semi-final is as follows;

- Men's K1 40 boats
- Women's K1 30 boats
- Men's C1 30 boats
- Women's C1 30 boats

Following the semi-final, the top 10 boats will proceed to the final.

Canoe Slalom Selections

The 2020 Oceania Canoe Slalom Championships is one of the selection events for the some of the Australians and New Zealanders. Extra invitational races are held to ensure respective selection criteria can be met. NZ athletes, please see the relevant selection policies.

Canoe Slalom Extreme (CSLX)

- * The competition will follow the ICF Rules for CSLX.
- * Following the time trial, there is progression to semi- finals and finals.
- * Competitors will race in their slalom bibs.

REGISTRATION & ENTRY FEES

- Entries have closed.
- The entry fee is \$130 per athlete with no limit on events entered
- Canoe Slalom Extreme (CSLX) only - \$80
- Payment to be made on entry or online to CSNZ at 03 1552-0230423-00 or cash at bib collection
- Training fees must be paid also at bib collection
- Tamariki Challenge- Free entry for volunteers, \$20 all others. Entry is still possible for the Tamariki Challenge
- Tamariki Challenge Training Camp will be held on Thursday 30th & Friday 31st. Further information may be obtained via email to camps@canoeslalomnz.org.nz

BODY NUMBER DISTRIBUTION

Body numbers will be distributed on Friday 31st 4.30pm – 6.00pm from the event office at the top of the course. Body numbers will not be distributed unless the entry fee has been paid and CSNZ Membership and waivers are completed.

Body numbers must be returned to the event office following the race prior to presentations. Any body number not returned will incur a \$100 fee.

EQUIPMENT CONTROL

- * Athletes are responsible to self-check their boat and gear prior to the competition. Equipment to do the self-check will be available in the boat storage area from Thursday 12.30pm.
- * A random selection of boats will be checked during the competition. Boats will be checked for weight, length & width and nose & tail dimensions. Buoyancy vests and helmets must meet ICF requirements.
- * Any athlete whose equipment does not pass a random check will be disqualified for that run (DSQ-R)

START INTERVALS

The start interval for heats will be 60 seconds, with 5 minutes between categories. Timing for the semifinal will be 90 seconds and 2minute intervals for the finals. There will be a 5 minute interval between the first 5 paddlers of the final and the next five.

START ORDER

Competitors will start in the reverse order of their latest ICF Ranking. Competitors without an ICF ranking will start at the beginning of the appropriate class.

The start order for the semi-final will be the reverse of the order of the results in the qualification phase. The start order for the final will be the reverse order of the results of each respective semi-final.

START PROCEDURE

Please only go up the conveyor belt 5 minutes before your start. Note conveyor belt ride is approx. 75 seconds

Please respect the start of the competitors before you and do not paddle near the start bollards. Competitors are to proceed to the start bollards immediately the previous competitor has left the start. NB There will be no call to the start.

The start will be a downstream stationary start from the bollards in the middle of the start pool. There is a countdown to the start time with a 10 second beep, then countdown from 5 seconds.

Note also the lane rope across the area of the waterfall and keep away from this area.

FINISH PROCEDURE

Competitors must not paddle back upstream across the finish line. Competitors may be called for equipment control at the end of the finish pool under the bridge.

Note there will be a media area at the end of the course- further information will be forthcoming on this procedure.

TIMING AND SCORING

Timing is to 100th of a second. Timing will be electronic with handheld backup.

SIGNAL TO CLEAR THE COURSE

A whistle will be used by the Judge should the competitor be required to clear the course e.g. to give way to another competitor

RESULTS

Official results will be posted on the noticeboard adjacent to the Event Office. Results will also be posted at www.canoeslalomnz.org.nz

Live results will be available from www.canoeslalomnz.org.nz and/or canoeicf.com.

No hard copies of results will be printed for teams. A complete set of results will be provided to a USB drive, **on request only**, following the completion of the competition.

MEDAL CEREMONY PROTOCOL

Following finals, medalists should assemble in front of the cafe 10 minutes prior to the medal ceremony. Competitors involved in the medal ceremonies are asked to wear team uniform and tidy gear.

DOPING CONTROL

DFNZ may conduct random drug testing at this competition. Athletes should have ID available.

ATHLETE FACILITIES

Change rooms & showers – to the right of the office.

Lockers available in changing rooms. Costs start at \$2 for 2 hours 40minutes up to \$8 for 10 hours

HEALTH & SAFETY

The safety briefing will be held at the top of the course before demos on Friday 31st.
All paddlers should be present including parents, officials and volunteers.

You must respect all of the signs, rules, staff and coaches otherwise you will be told to leave the site.

- No swimming in the lake
- At all times on the lake or the course you must have a PFD and helmet
- Do not go near the pump intake
- If you hear the siren at the pumps – the course is turning off or on. You must be clear of the course.
- If the conveyer is not on then you must not go up to the course.
- No walking up the conveyer belt
- No entry into the riverbed when there is no water.
- Have your pfd and helmet done up.

In case of earthquake/fire the fire alarm will be activated and staff will direct all persons to assemble at the emergency assembly point, the Pou Kapua at the park entrance.

SPECTATORS

Free admission for spectators

ACCESS & PARKING

Note that parking is complimentary

- No spectators are allowed to walk off the path around the course.
- The race office and results area at the top of the course is out of bounds to spectators
- Spectators must walk around the outside – not under the waterfall and on the inside
- Athletes, officials and team staff must have PFDs on if they are on the grass and on the inside of the course
- Please respect the out of bounds
- Your kayaks must be clean before entering the water

SUN PROTECTION

The UltraViolet (UV) index is moderate to high during the middle part of the day and it is recommended that broad spectrum (SPF 30+) sunscreen be worn on exposed skin to protect against sunburn.
