MINUTES OF THE XXXVIII ICF ORDINARY CONGRESS HELD IN ROME, ITALY 4-6 NOVEMBER 2021





Opening of the Congress

The 2021 ICF Congress had been postponed twice because of Covid, but the first ever ICF hybrid Congress officially got underway in Rome on Thursday 4 Ñovember. A total of 108 federations registered for the Congress, with 60 federations attending in person.

Italian Olympic Committee president Giovanni Malago opened the Congress, praising the work of outgoing ICF President Jose Perurena. He said Mr Perurena's dedication to fight, defend and support canoeing had produced results which were "very clear before your eyes".

President's Report

The President praised the Italian Federation for agreeing to host the ICF Congress in very difficult circumstances.

"We need to face the future together",
Perurena said. "The IOC is in a great
moment of change, and all the federations
are working to offer the best of our sports.
We cannot just leave our problems alone.
We have to evolve. If we remain stuck, we
will not have a future. We have to be ready if
the IOC asks us to make changes. We have to
protect our quotas."

Mr Perurena said he was leaving because he always felt three terms would be enough, and it was time for new ideas and new generations.

One minute silence to remember those that have passed away since our previous Congress.

A video message from IOC President Thomas Bach was played to the Congress. In his address, President Bach praised the leadership of Mr Perurena.

"The strong standing of canoeing is because of the work of all at the ICF, but especially the strong leadership of Jose Perurena," Bach said.

"The ICF is fit for the future, on and off the water. The ICF always leads the way with innovation, introducing exciting new disciplines that will inspire a younger generation.

"You have set a strong foundation for your successor to build on. On a personal note, thank you for your friendship which I have valued dearly for many years and will continue to do so in the future."

Secretary General Report

Also a large thank you to organisers and local authorities for working alongside us. We know it's not been cheap or easy to host events. We had very high interest in the Olympics and our world championships in 2021, with the highest number ever of national broadcasters. The ICF is in a stronger and more robust position than it has ever been.

QUESTIONS: In response to two questions from British Canoeing, the ICF committed to consulting with the NF's over the Olympic qualification process, and to a process which it hoped to bring to an end the use of the Court of Arbitration For Sport.
