

4 LOCATION

Situated just 10 minutes from Nottingham City Centre, Holme Pierrepont Country Park is home to the National Water Sports Centre and British Canoeing housing the headquarters of the organisation and, the Olympic Sprint and Paralympic Paracanoe performance programmes. Holme Pierrepont is also home to the British Freestyle Championships, National Sprint Regattas and the British Canoe Polo Championships.

4.1 Location of airports, rail network and roads to the venue/city

Nottingham is considered to be the best city outside London for public transport links and is one of the greenest cities in the UK. Based in the heart of the country, Nottingham occupies a fantastic central location with excellent transport links via road, rail and air.

By Road

At the heart of the UK road network Nottingham is 20 minutes off the M1 motorway. As you approach Nottingham, follow the brown tourist signs for the National Water Sports Centre which will direct you to the site.

<u>By Bus</u>

Nottingham bus routes 11 and 11C have a stop a 10 minute walk from the White Water Course.

Travel by bus to Nottingham from East Midlands Airport, Birmingham, Manchester and London as well as many other cities is also available.

4.2 Weather in June

4.3 Currency

The currency used in the UK is the Pound Sterling which has the international abbreviation GBP £. Major credit and debit cards are accepted widely.



4.4 Local Attractions

<u>Holme Pierrepont Country Park</u> itself has a whole host of activities on site including a lagoon wipeout, climbing wall, sky trail, mini golf, Segway's, tubing and the large rural site to explore.

Nottingham is a city in central England's Midlands region. It's known for its role in the Robin Hood legend and for the hilltop Nottingham Castle Museum and Art Gallery, rebuilt many times since the medieval era. In the Lace Market area, once the centre of the world's lace industry, the Galleries of Justice Museum has crime-related exhibits. Wollaton Hall is an ornate Elizabethan mansion with gardens and a deer park.

There are also a wide array of social activities within the City Centre (distances from HPP):

- Nottingham Castle 6km (3.7 miles)
- Museum of Nottingham Life at Brewhouse Yard 6.4km (4 miles)
- Nottingham Caves 5.3km (3.3 miles)
- Lace Market 5.1km (3.2 miles)
- Galleries of Justice 3.8km (3.8 miles)
- National Ice Centre 5km (3 miles)

- Wollaton Park 13.5 (8.4 miles)
- University of Nottingham Lakeside Arts Centre 15km (9.3 miles)

5 VENUE

5.1 Description of competition venue and sport infrastructure

Set in 270 acres (1.1 km2) of parkland, <u>Holme Pierrepont Country Park</u> not only offers a host of water activities, but also a range of land based activities. The centre is made up of three distinct pieces of water:

- A 2,000 metre regatta lake
- A 700 m purpose-built white water canoe slalom course
- A canoe polo and open water swimming lagoon

Holme Pierrepont Country Park is owned by Nottinghamshire County Council and managed by Serco Leisure who work with local partners to offer an extensive sports development programme. The site offers many activities including foot golf, sky trail, climbing wall, lagoon wipe-out, archery combat and mini golf.

5.3 Presentation of the technical aspects of the course

Built in 1986, the course is made primarily from concrete. It is approximately 1500 metres long, drops just over 4 metres in height to produce Grade 3 white water rapids. River flow is dependent on rainfall but due to the large catchment of the Trent, flows between 16 and 25 cubic metres per second are normal. Control of flow to ensure a consistent feature is achieved using a mechanical inlet gate.

The course had a refit in 2009 with design by athletes and rafters to ensure the course can stage major sporting competitions whilst providing the maximum thrills for day to day white water rafters and paddlers. Along with essential maintenance, some of the original concrete obstacles were removed and Omniflots (large plastic movable blocks) were added.

5.4 Feature

Over its 35 year history the white water course has undergone much development. Despite a number of world class features already existing, one of the objectives of hosting the World Championships was to create a new hole feature for freestyle. Work has now been completed and the feature is in place allowing athletes an opportunity to train ahead of the Championships in July.

The Twin Waves provides a stable hole feature with good eddy service from river right. Approximately 6 metres wide and created by a drop of approximately 30 centimetres the feature has a good pile and retains well.

The Squirt feature is in the Top Pool immediately above the Twin Waves. It is accessible from large eddies making for opportunity in both downtime and surface based rides.

6.2 ICF Masters World Championships

In addition we are pleased to announce that the first World Masters Championships will be held in conjunction with the event.

On Thursday 30 June and Friday 1 July, paddlers will each compete on two features (Inlet Gate and Troll/Muncher) with their aggregate score (as in the World Cups) counting to their final result. The winners of each category will then all compete in a Super Final on Saturday 2 July on the World Championship feature.

The event will feature categories for men and women in the following age groups:

- 40-49 year olds
- 50-59 year olds
- 60+ year olds

6.3 Festival Events open to Competitors

Throughout the training and competition period a number of festival events will be available for competitors to take part and enjoy all aspects of Freestyle and the course at Nottingham. These events include:

- World's Biggest Loop.
 - This is a freestyle kayaking high-jump competition. Competitors take turns in aiming to knock off the highbar with their boat.
 - Held in the Inlet Gate
- Downriver Freestyle
 - Use a variety of waves, holes, eddylines and rapids to show off your skills and rack up the points.
 - Held mid-course under the 2nd bridge from the Pyramid Pool to the Looping Pool
- Flatwater Freestyle
 - We don't need a hole or a wave to do impressive Freestyle tricks. For many paddlers, flatwater is their local training location and are able to do impressive combinations of manoeuvres. This festival competition aims to allow paddlers showcase these skills.

6.4 Festival Events open to all (including ICF Competitors)

One of the aims of the Host Organising Committee in bringing the World Championships to Nottingham has always been to involve the local community in the festival. These events are aimed at anyone (regardless of being on a national team) who wants to actively participate in the festival.

- Flatwater Freestyle
 - We are extending the invitation of the flatwater freestyle competition to everyone around the world, globally. More details on how to enter and get involved will be shared via social media closer to the event. So tell your friends to get training!
- Downriver Freestyle
 - A second Downriver freestyle competition will be available for all to enter during Super Saturday (2nd July) in the same format as the first.
- Syncro Freestyle
 - The Inlet Gate is a unique feature in the freestyle landscape that allows a consistent playground for multiple athletes to compete at once. This allows for the first syncro freestyle competition to be held at a World Championships festival. Paddlers will need to throw down their moves together in order to score big!





- RoughWaters SUP
 - The paddling community is one that opens our arms to all who enjoy experiencing the white water. We are extending the invite to our friends in the SUP community so we can experience the river with a diversity of craft. The Festival will be the final of a 3 part series (combining the results of the Hurley Classic and Dee Fest) on Super Saturday (2nd July). Get involved and show us your SUP skills!
- World Freestyle League
 - The Nottingham Freestyle League goes global in this fun, low key series of events before the World Championship competition. Compete with your friends and locals on a variety of features across the course in this three part (17th June, 21st June and 24th June) series. Our winner will be crowned at the Opening Ceremony of the ICF World Championships on Sunday night (26th June).
- Celebrations/Parties
 - We are looking forward to celebrating your successes at these Championships during the parties that are planned in the final days of the competition period.

6.5 Festival Events aimed at specific groups

- Younguns Freestyle World Championships Tour Stop
 - Younguns freestyle is the UK's youth development and competition programme which has introduced many of the top names in our sport to freestyle. The UK tour invites all youth paddlers from the UK and abroad to learn new skills, make new friends and compete in fun competition on 18th and 19th of June.
- ICF Development Camp
 - The ICF are finalising details of the ICF development camp to be held in conjunction with the World Championships. Details of who this camp is aimed at and how to be involved will be released by the ICF Freestyle Committee shortly.

7 TRAINING

7.1 Official Training

Official training will take place from Wednesday 22 to Sunday 26 June 2022.

There will be 1 training slot per day per nation. Exact timings will be determined after the numeric entries close. Additional open training opportunities will also be scheduled.

There will be no additional cost for paddling on the white water course during Official Training or Competition times.

7.2 Unofficial Training

Should any athletes/teams wish to use Holme Pierrepont as a training base in the days, weeks or months prior to the World Championships, they are able to do so during standard opening hours (note that on rare occasions the course may be closed due to exclusive bookings).

We ask all athletes to adhere to the sites' rules. We also ask that all athletes ensure that if travelling internationally they follow their government guidance and the UK guidelines.

7.3 Water Safety

Athletes must follow the venue protocols when training. Water safety is the responsibility of individuals with the use of a buddy system by water users supporting each other.

During competition two qualified Water Stadia Rescue personnel will be water side throughout the competition - one at the feature and one downstream of the feature.

7.4 On-site Gym

On site at Holme Pierrepoint Country Park a gym is also available (overlooking the regatta lake). This includes a 60 station fitness gym, dedicated weights and strength space, personal training and workout classes. 9.1 Entry process & deadlines

Entries and accreditation requests must be made by the National Federation using the ICF's online entries system (SDP): <u>https://icf.msl.es/icf/icf.jsp</u>

Numerical Entries

- Numerical entries close: **13 May 2022**
- You must submit through SDP the number of athletes you will enter into each event.
- Please also give indicative numbers for the overall number of athletes and team personnel who will attend the event with your delegation.

Nominal Entries

- Nominal entries close: **17 June 2022**
- Each athlete competing must be entered by name.
- Team personnel must also be submitted for accreditation at this time. These entries will be used to produce the accreditation cards for all teams.

Entries or accreditation requests sent directly to the committee or the event organiser will NOT be accepted.

A Participation Fee of GBP £170 will be charged for each accredited athlete and team official, to cover the duration of the Official Training and Competition phases of the 2022 ICF Canoe Freestyle World Championships.

A UK 'Standard Visitor' Visa will be required for athletes, officials and support personnel from countries which UK Border Agency has categorised as 'Visa Nationals'.

11 MEDICAL SERVICES & WATER QUALITY

On-site medical support, in accordance with ICF standards will be on site throughout the official training and competition periods and we will liaise with all the relevant local authorities towards any emergency requirements.

Queen's Medical Centre Nottingham is 7.7 km (4.8 miles) providing 24 hour a day accident and emergency services.

NHS Urgent Care Centre, Seaton House, City Link, Nottingham NG2 4LA is located 4.3km (2.7 miles) from HPP, and open daily 7am-9pm providing minor injury emergency care.

The water facilities at the National Water Sports Centre are supplied from a variety of sources including surface streams and the River Trent. The vast majority of people using the watersports facilities have no ill effects at all however to reduce the risk of illness it is suggested that paddlers avoid swallowing the water, cover minor scratches with a plaster and wash or shower as soon as possible and before eating/drinking. If you fall ill with symptoms after water sports, particularly from 3-19 days following, then see a doctor immediately.
