Registration

Entries or accreditation requests sent directly to the committee or the competition organiser will NOT be accepted.

Cancellation conditions

4.2. Brandenburg on the Havel

Brandenburg an der Havel, the so-called "city on the river", is a city in the German state of Brandenburg. With a population of around 72,000, it is the third largest and, in terms of area, the largest independent city in the state.

The city lies on the Havel. In the city area, the Havel branches into several lakes and canals, which form a series of islands that characterise the cityscape. The city got its nickname "city in the river" because one fifth of the city area consists of water. Water and activities on, in and around the water are practically part of the city's genetics.

There is a 15 km² natural lake landscape, most of which is flowed through by the Havel or connected to it. No wonder, then, that Brandenburg an der Havel is considered the gateway to Europe's largest contiguous water sports area. In the north of the city lies the Beetzsee, one of the most beautiful natural regatta courses in the world.

Brandenburg an der Havel is where beautiful landscapes meet and offer seven nature reserves. Storks, cranes, eagles, herons, kingfishers and beavers are at home in this beautiful, Mark Brandenburg landscape. Venue Brandenburg an der Havel in Germany.

Arrival

It is located about 40 km from Potsdam and 70 km from Berlin, where the nearest international airport Berlin Brandenburg (BER) "Willy Brandt" is located. Therefore, there are very good possibilities to travel to the competition venue by public transport. Brandenburg an der Havel can be reached from Berlin by bus and train in a maximum of 1.5 hours. By car, the journey to the city takes one hour.

The organiser does not provide transfers to or from the airports or train stations. These are to be organised by the participants themselves.

Arriving by train from BER Berlin Brandenburg Airport

From BER Airport, a train, RegionalBahn or Airport Express leaves approx. every 30 minutes in the direction of Berlin Ostbahnhof. From there, you can reach the Brandenburg Hauptbahnhof station in approx. 60 minutes by RegionalExpress 1.

Travel by train from LEJ Leipzig Airport to Brandenburg


From LEJ Leipzig Airport, an ICE train departs once an hour in the direction of Berlin Hauptbahnhof (main station). From there, you can reach the Brandenburg Hauptbahnhof station in approx. 60 minutes by RegionalExpress 1.



4.4. Sports village

An area reserved exclusively for athletes will be set up. The delegations will each have a reserved box of $15m^2$ depending on the number of teams present per delegation.

This area is exclusively available to athletes and contains, among other things:

- Catering & Drinks
- An area for relaxation
- Game display
- Medical care
- Sanitary facilities

4.5. Catering

Good food is an essential key to the success of an event for everyone involved. It contributes decisively to the satisfaction of athletes, organisers, helpers and visitors and has an influence on the overall mood of the event.





Sustainability and climate neutrality are important topics that we take very seriously. On the way to becoming more climate-friendly, we would also like to focus on sustainability in our catering offer. Depending on the requirements in connection with the Corona pandemic, which is still ongoing at the time, we will pay particular attention to the following elements:

- environmentally friendly alternatives to disposable tableware,
- Provision of vegetable dishes to choose from,
- seasonal and regional ingredients,
- Avoidance of food waste and
- short access routes (transport).

The Food & Drink section is divided into the following three subsections:

- Visitors "Food Mile
- Catering for athletes, organisers and helpers
- VIP catering, VIPs will be catered for in the VIP area next to the competition tower.

4.6. Medical & Doping

As part of the administrative complex of the regatta course, located directly at the entrance to the athletes' area on the right-hand side, the Medical Centre is easy to find. Its access is barrier-free. This is where the medical care is located. Not far from the regatta course there are 2 hospitals at a distance of 3 km.



There is a separate room for doping controls in the sanitary and washing facilities, which is accessible through the anteroom of the entrance to the men's toilet and is also barrier-free.





4.7. Press area

In addition to the press centre in the function building, designated press areas will be set up for the press representatives near the competition tower with the best view of the pitches and plenty of space for taking photos. One area is located in a covered segment of the visitors' stands



4.8. Accreditation

The accreditation is located in the entrance to the regatta course in a building about 200 metres away from the regatta course. There, participants will receive their access badges before the access control at the entrance area of the competition area.

4.9. Visitors

There is an area at the regatta course for travelling fans. Camping is possible here. Caravans and campers can also be accommodated there. In order to stay overnight here, it is absolutely necessary that the fans register in advance. With the registration, fans will then be accredited and have free entry to the event. Prices and modalities will be announced in Bulletin 2. Selected hotels and guesthouses can already be found in the section 4.2.





4.10. VIP

A special feature of the "Beetzsee" regatta course is the VIP grandstand under the large roof that spans the competition tower and is intended as the VIP area for this ECA European Championship.



4.11. Security

For the safety of the entire site, the sports equipment, all participants and also the campsite on site as well as for the visitors, a high level of security is guaranteed around the clock from Tuesday to Sunday with the help of an experienced and proven service provider.





5. Equipment and safety regulations

All equipment must comply with the current international technical rules for ICF Canoe Polo¹. Each of the boats used in ICF events must carry the ICF label and the boat manufacturer must be registered with the ICF². This regulation may lead to spot checks.



Further equipment according to ICF Canoe Polo Rules:

Each athlete must wear appropriate equipment. This includes a safety helmet with a strap attached to the chin underneath and a face mask. The helmet must be properly adjusted to provide maximum protection (from the base of the chin to the base of the skull). The grille has a minimum distance of 10 mm from the athlete's nose. The athlete must also wear a buoyancy aid.
