8. Competition Format (1) The competition will be conducted in accordance with the 2025 JCF Competition Rules complying with ICF Competition Rules.
(2) ICF Slalom Ranking Race: Race 1 (Heat) and Race 2 (Final) on 26th April.
(3) Kayak Cross: Best of two time trials
(4) Competitors must wear a life jacket with a minimum buoyancy of 6.12 kg.
(5) Start times will not be adjusted for individual athletes.

19. Others
- (1) Only one coach or other accompanying person per athlete is allowed in the competition area. Please apply at the same time as the athlete's application for participation.
 - (2) In the event of an accident during the game, the organizer will provide first aid, but in principle, the responsibility lies with the athlete concerned. We do not assume any liability for injury compensation.
 - (3) Self-rescue is required during official training.
 - (4) All participants must securely seal their trash and dispose of it outside the venue.
 - (5) Do not leave any drinks or masks unattended around the competition course.
 - (6) The schedule is subject to change due to weather conditions.
 - (7) Camping, sleeping in cars, etc. at the competition venue and car park is not permitted.
 - (8) Everyone should take their own infection control measures.
 - (9) This competition is being held by the Sports Promotion Lottery Fund.

***Submission of Parental Consent Form for Competitors Under 18**

1. This competition is subject to doping control under the Japanese Anti-Doping Code.
2. All participants in this competition (including competitors under the age of 18; hereinafter the same) are deemed to have agreed to be subject to doping control procedures in accordance with the Japan Anti-Doping Code at the time of entry to the competition. For competitors under the age of 18, it is deemed that they have obtained the consent of their legal guardians by participating in this competition.
3. Participants under 18 years old must bring and carry a consent form signed by a parent or legal guardian. The consent form can be downloaded from the Japan Anti-Doping Agency (JADA) website: <https://www.playtruejapan.org/jada/u18.html>.

If a participant under 18 is selected for doping control, they must submit the signed consent form to the designated doping control

officer.

The parental consent form only needs to be submitted once while the athlete is under 18. If they are selected for doping control again, they must inform the officer that the form has already been submitted.

If the parental consent form cannot be submitted at the doping control venue, it must be sent by mail to the JADA Secretariat within seven days after the test. Failure to submit the consent form will not affect the doping control procedure in any way.

4. A competitor who refuses or avoids a doping test (urine, blood or any other type of specimen) at the event, fails to follow the instructions of a laboratory technician, or is unable to complete the doping test procedure due to personal circumstances such as travelling home, etc., may be in breach of the anti-doping rules. Please note that if you are found to be in breach of anti-doping rules, you will be subjected to a penalty in accordance with the Japan Anti-Doping Code.
5. Please note that competitors who are subject to blood tests, whether in-competition or out-of-competition, will need to rest for two hours after the end of the competition/exercise in order for the blood sample to be taken.
