

Weather Conditions

Based on long-term climate norms for the Halifax–Dartmouth region, the event period typically experiences mild to warm summer conditions.

Daytime temperatures: 20–23°C

Overnight temperatures: 12–15°C


Occasional highs: Up to 26–28°C

Location

Dartmouth (PUNAMU'KWATI'JK)

Affectionately known as the “City of Lakes,” Dartmouth, Nova Scotia is home to 23 distinctive lakes, each with its own unique natural character. The community hosts four of Nova Scotia’s eight sprint canoe clubs and serves as an important training hub for national-team athletes. Located just across the harbour from Halifax’s vibrant downtown core, Dartmouth offers a distinctly different experience—blending modern shops, eateries, and cafés with forests, trails, and waterways. Just minutes away, visitors can easily transition from the energy of the city to the quiet calm of Dartmouth’s parks and beaches.



Facilities



Lake Banook (PANUK)

International Racecourse:

The Lake Banook International Racecourse forms the operational heart of the 2026 Masters competition venue and is owned and managed by Atlantic Division Canoe Kayak Canada (ADCKC). Purpose-built for high-performance sprint racing, the racecourse integrates athlete services, technical operations, and spectator engagement within a compact and efficient footprint.

The finish-line complex is anchored by the David M. Jones Judges Tower, fully refurbished in 2023 as part of the Canoe '22 Legacy and the North American Indigenous Games (NAIG). The tower serves as the central hub for officials, timing, and sport presentation, supporting modern international competition standards.

Competition operations and venue services are delivered in close collaboration with the resident rowing club and three canoe clubs - North Star, Mic Mac, Senobe, and Banook - whose facilities and volunteer expertise are fully integrated into the event footprint. The Master 2026 athletes' village, disembarkation area, and medal presentations are centred around the finish area at the base of the lake, creating an electrifying atmosphere befitting the 2026 ICF Masters Canoe Sprint World Championships.



Parking

At this time, there is no designated event parking. Parking availability will be consistent with what is typically available in the surrounding area during any event. Participants are strongly encouraged to use the arranged transportation to and from the designated Masters accommodations. Please note that the site will also be preparing for the 2026 ICF Junior and U23 Canoe Sprint World Championships, which will further impact parking availability. Any changes will be communicated through official bulletin updates.

Special Rules – Masters World Championships

1. Entries

1.1 No Country Entry Limits: There is no limit to the number of boats that may be entered per country in each event.

1.2 Minimum Entries per Event: A minimum of three (3) boats must be entered for an event/category to be held.

If fewer than three (3) boats are entered, those entries will be merged into the next younger age group where possible.

.....

2. Age Groups

2.1 Singles Age Groups: All single boat events (K1, C1) will be contested in five (5) year age groups.

2.2 Team Age Groups:

All team boat events (K2, C2, K4, C4) will be contested in the following age groups: 35-39 • 40-49 • 50-59 • 60-69 • 70+

2.3 Maximum Age Category: The maximum age category for all single boat events is 75+. The maximum age category for all team boat events is 70+.

2.4 Age Determination in Team Boats: In team boats (K2, C2, K4, C4), the age group will be determined by the age of the youngest athlete in the crew.

.....

3. Event Participation Limits

3.1 Maximum Events per Athlete

Each athlete may compete in:

- A maximum of two (2) single events; and
- A maximum of four (4) team events.

An event is defined as a specific boat class and distance (e.g., K1 200m = one event).

3.2 Additional Team Event Exception: A fifth(5th) team event may be permitted only if it is a K4 or C4 event.

3.3 Canoe and Kayak Participation: Athletes may compete in both canoe and kayak events, provided all entry limits above are respected.



3.4 Combined Age Class Events: The Organizers reserve the right to combine age classes where necessary to enhance the quality and viability of competition. Results will be separated by age class, and medals will be awarded accordingly.

4. Mixed and International Crews

4.1 Combined Country Crews: Athletes from different countries may compete together in team boat events. These boats will not have a defined country designation in the entries.

4.2 Anthem Protocol for Combined Crews: If a combined-country crew wins an event, the ICF anthem will be played.

5. Scheduling & Start Lists

5.1 Back-to-Back Races: Athletes entered in back-to-back races are responsible for reaching the start line on time.

5.2 Startlist Changes: Every reasonable effort will be made by the Host Organizing Committee to adjust or redraw start lists to minimize scheduling conflicts where possible.

6. Medal Ceremonies

6.1 Medal Allocation: All valid categories, meeting minimum entry requirements, will be awarded medals provided by the Organizing Committee.

6.2 Official World Championship Status: Only events meeting the minimum entry requirement to constitute a valid World Championship title will include an official medal ceremony with national anthem protocol. Mixed national team boats winning a Championship will have the ICF anthem played during the ceremony.

Visa information

Depending on your citizenship, visitors to Canada may require a visa to enter the country. **Processing times for visa applications** vary depending on the visa office and the time of the year. Participants are encouraged to check the processing times calculator for guidance, but it is recommended to apply approximately **12 weeks** in advance of their departure date to ensure they receive the visa in time for the start of the event. Federations can check to see if they require a visa through **this link**. 
