Development

- ICF and ECA TIP Projects have continued to develop alongside the Worlds in Bratislava (SVK), La Seu d'Urgell (ESP) and at the European Championships in Banja Luka (BIH).
- International Coach Seminar WWC: December 2018 in Kraljevica (CRO).
- Annual International Coach Seminars 2019 on-line and International WWC Youth Kayaking development with Erasmus funding is continuing
- Implementation of Online Coaching and ITO Examinations with 14 new ITO's qualified in 2021 and 7 to be homologised at international competitions in 2022
- Development of an International Wildwater Coaching network as one of the proposals for new sources of income

International Development: Africa, South America & Asia

- Word Cup Races in China in December 2019 building on the success of International WWC Races at the same venues in Panzihuhua City, Liu Ku and the Salween River (CHN), December 2019
- Successfully organised two classic mass-start world cups (China 2019 and Treignac 2021). This shows that the adaptation of the rules and new formats of competition are a reality.

3. Tasks undertaken since the last ICF Congress

Issues

- We are waiting on feedback from the Chinese Canoe Association before any further planning meetings take place for the 2023 World Championship Races in China

WWC Objectives for the next 5 Years remain:

- To grow the sport at National, Regional and International Level
- To increase the number of nations and move from being a largely European Sport to one with true World-wide appeal
- To make the rules more open to new races formats and new ideas
- To stay connected with nature and sustainability The main Issues:

- Increasing resources for Athlete Development
- finding new organisers & venues
- Replacing the 2020 ICF WWC Championships & World Cups in Nantahalla & Albright (USA) Cancelled due to Covid-19 Pandemic. Committee proposal is to target 2024.
- increasing our range of Online services.

- Implement WWC rule changes following the next ICF Congress in November 2021 focused on universality and sustainable competition formats
- Simplify Boat Rules to support basic competition in Generic Kayaks, Sit-ontops & Open Canoes, Wavehoppers & other boat types
- Develop local, regional and international manufacturers of Generic Wildwater and Specific WWC Boats
- Build on the existing International development program and making a wider range of boats and equipment available
- Increasing flexibility in the rules
- Enable competition in commercially available canoes and kayaks to increase accessibility to extreme water, engage new countries and reduce transport costs
