#### **PREFACE**

The ICF Congress and Board of Directors have been facilitating the consistent development in Canoeing in the last 28 years with sufficient Budget.

The Development Programme is one of the main factors within the ICF overall activities regarding the attention, efforts and financial support!

The ICF development and Coach's Education programme has earned a good reputation from the IOC, Olympic Solidarity, and have been supporting by the organisers of the various Continental/Regional/Multi Games besides the host national federations of World Championships. The Development Programme appreciated by the federations, athletes and coaches including in the various projects.

The contents and the Budget of the DP reflected the opinion of the Continental Representatives, Technical Committees followed by the approval of the Board of Directors along with the financial support from the IOC and Olympic Solidarity.

Separated amounts were allocated to the Continental Association from the DP Budget for given them authority of the usage that amount for development targets.

The sum of the ICF DP Budget is unchanged in the last 10 years period. This fact determinates the range of financial opportunities given by the Development Programme.

This report summarizes the executed actions and the results achieved by the ICF Canoe Sprint Development Programme 2012-14.

#### **1. TALENT IDENTIFICATION PROGRAMME in 2013 and 2014**

##### **1.1 The aim of TIP**

In order to identify and support the progression of the most potential athletes in Canoeing from the developing and the financially weak National Federations the ICF established the Talent Identification Programme in 2009.

The aim of TIP's is to improve the athletes' (and coaches) technique, physical and psychological level and knowledge of training methods by providing the best opportunity to learn from the high leveled coaches. This method ensures the progress of the potential athletes in the Canoe Sprint discipline who may qualify for the Olympic Games in Rio 2016 and beyond.

##### **1.2 The selection to the TIP**



- With the cooperation of the Continental Associations 52 National Federations were selected for ICF' support possibility within the framework of the Development Programme
- Information letters were released with the application form to the national federations via Paddle Away and the Continental Associations. In addition separated e-mails were sent direct to the selected federations.
- The selection of the invited athletes to the programme has been considering with the established priorities such as support women and men canoe participation most and with consideration of gender and continental balance as far as the applications allowed these concepts.
- The final selection of the athletes also depends on the progress of their performance regarding test and competition' result.

#### 1.4 Talent Identification Programme in 2013

Training Camps and participation in both Junior/U23 in Welland and Senior WCh in Duisburg were organized.

##### 1.4.1 TIP in the Junior/U23 WCh in Welland Canada

The ICF with cooperation and financial support of the host organized a training camp followed by participation in the World Championships. Support was offered for 20 athletes' inclusion to the programme with the condition of covering all expenses including travelling. The payment of the expenses was shared between the Org. Comm. and ICF. Canada paid 70 % while the ICF 30% of the total amount.

Finally 16 athletes took part in the programme instead 20 because some of the invited had visa problem for traveling to Canada

#### 1.4.3 TIP in the Junior/U23 and SEN WCH in Szeged and Moscow 2014

The places and dates of the two WCHs in 2014 were relatively close to each other. Therefore we organized the TIP in two places consecutive this year as in Szeged and in Moscow.



33 NFs sent applications for 68 athlete's inclusion to the programme. The athletes were selected and invited in accordance with the available places. Athletes in women and men canoe categories received the priority at the invitation.

#### **The financial responsibilities:**

The both host Hungarian and Russian National Federations of the World Championships provides 30 and 45 places respectively free of charge for TIP. The ICF partly or fully covers travelling expenses of the participants to the venues.

### 1.5 Coaches' support for the athletes in the TIP

The objective of the Talent Identification Programme is to provide supports to developing athletes and coaches by experienced coaches in training camps and competition.

The ICF has been appointing 3-4 high leveled coaches to each programme for assisting to the athletes during training and participation. National coaches can also participate in the programme as far as they cooperate and consulting with the ICF appointed coaches and pay their own expenses.

### 1.6 Boats and Paddles

The two biggest boat producers NELO and PLASTEX have been supporting the ICF TIP with free boat rentals for many years!

These Co.'s deliver the boats to the place of the World Ch. and providing the requested number (approx 40 boats per event) and type of boats in due time free of charge!

This assistance is the key for the successful organization of the TIP or without their support the expenses of boat rentals would be high amount!

BRACA paddle producer Co. provides about 40 pieces of high quality paddles in the last 10 years. This support is great help direct to the athletes /NFs!

The ICF has also signed a partnership agreement with Jantex Paddles, and they give 10 paddles to the ICF yearly.

**The ICF extends its appreciation to the named partners for their great support!**

### 1.7 National Federations' support

The Polish, Canadian, German, Hungarian and Russian National Federations hosted the ICF TIP projects in the past three years with great logistical and



financial support. Their mentioned contributions for canoeing development are essential and great help for the TIP.

The assistances provided are as follows:

- Cooperating with the ICF from the planning to the execution
- Provides Room and Board for the participants free of charge or at discount prices
- No payment was requested for accreditation fees
- Provides coach's support i.e. cover their lodge and board expenses,
- Appointed official assigned to the TIP Programme to assist in the preparation and the running of the event
- Assists to participants for obtaining visa
- Organized local pick-up from the airport and back and the local transportations free of charge

### **1.9 Evaluation of the results and progresses of the athletes**

However the measurement of improvement of the athlete's technique, speed, physical fitness and their increased motivation toward Canoeing is difficult we believe that the programme achieved its targets!

The gap between the elite athletes and the developing athletes' performance is decreasing and the overall level of Canoeing has been progressing in the various continents and its Events! These results are definitely the success of the ICF Development Programme!

**It is a great achievement that 8 athletes qualified and participated to the Olympic Games 2012 who have taken part in the Talent Identification Programme before!**

**Another success is a bronze medal in the U23 WCh in MC1 200m 2014!**



In addition the benefit of the Development Programme is strengthening the connection between the ICF, the Continental Associations, the National Federations, coaches and athletes.

## **2 Women Canoe Development**

**Under the IOC requirement the ICF is committed to reach gender equity gradually.**

One of the objectives is to support the women canoe development and the participation of women canoeists in major ICF and Continental events.

The development of the Women Canoe also serves the support of men canoe position in the Olympic Games by provides the gender equity in canoe category!

The aim of introduce and develop women canoe is to have the balance for kayak and canoe events with the expanding its practice in more clubs and countries; improve the athlete's standard worldwide by progressing technique, physical level and knowledge of training methods.

The ICF provides training opportunities and experts to facilitate this process.

### **2.1 History and the ICF actions for supporting women canoe development:**

- 2009: 1st Training Camp and demonstration event was organised in the WCh's in Canada
- 2010: C1 200m event inclusion to the WCh's programme
- 2010 -11-13 Financial support for participation in WCh's and TIP
- 2012, 2013 and 2014 Women Canoe Cups in FRA /Boulogne with financial support of the participants
- Women Canoe Events are in the programme of all Continental Championships, (except Oceania)
- COPAC, in the American Continent included those events in 2006
- C1 women event included in YOG and African Youth Games 2014.
- Women canoe included in the official programme of the Pan American Games, Toronto 2015; both in sprint and slalom
- Women Canoe Symposium - CAN 2013
- The situation in Women Canoe and gender equity in canoeing presentation at the Coach's Congress in Spain
- Suggestion for introducing C1 500 and C2 200m events in the Jun, U/23 and Sen. World Championships from 2015 to the ICF Congress 2014
- Suggestion for C1W 200m event inclusion to the Olympic Games 2020.

### **2.2 Information of Women Canoe position in the ICF**

The approximately 50 active NFs in women canoe category is a good achievement in the short history of this category but the participation in the World



Senior Championships is not progressing much! The good sign that the participation in the Junior and U23 WCh is increasing!

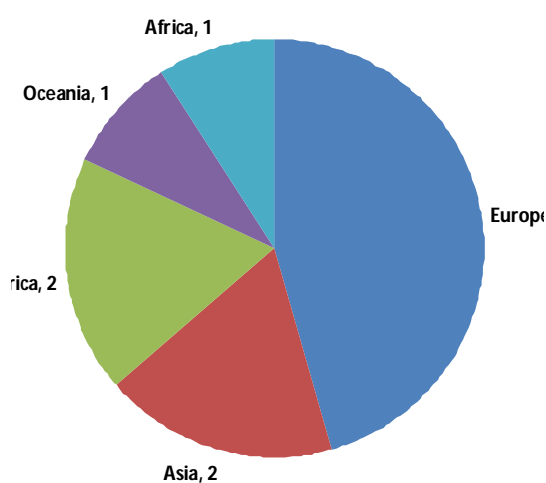

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### 2.3 Information on the Women Canoe Cup Events in Boulogne

The ICF with the cooperation and support Boulogne Canoe Kayak Club (BCK) in France organized one week programme for women canoeists from 2012. The event starts with Training Camp following by Junior/Senior competition at the same place in 2012, 13 and 14. There are C1, C2 and C4 events on 200m, 500m and 2000m distances.

The ICF covers the lodge and board expenses for 2 athletes per national federation in Boulogne whilst the participants need cover their travelling to Paris and back.

### 3. Development for Men Canoe Category

Regarding to the lower interest in canoe category (men and women) as in kayaking at club and national level the ICF decided to make actions for supports canoe category development in the frame of the Development Programme!

Statistics clearly show the weakness of the Canoe Category relative to the Kayak Category at elite levels regarding the number of participant National Federations in competitions and the National Federations' involvement in men and women canoe at the national level.

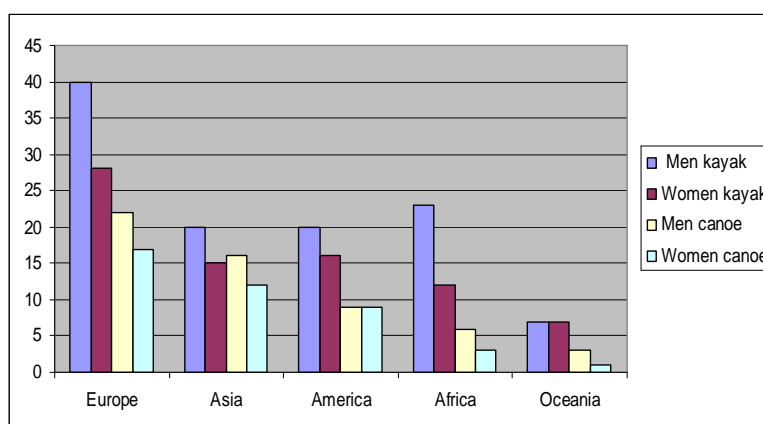


Table Continental involvement into the 4 categories

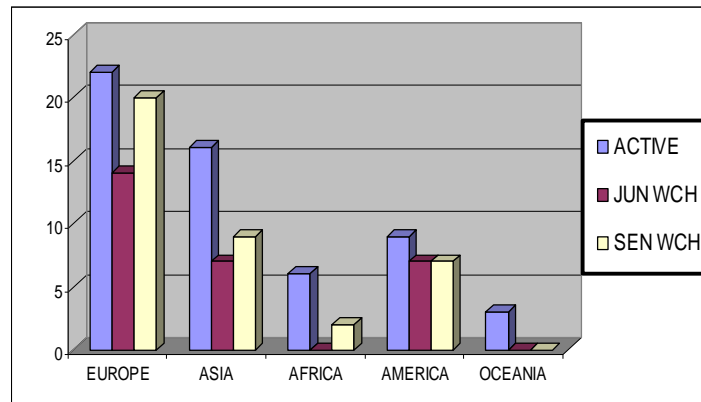

## CANOE MEN ACTIVITY AND PARTICIPATION IN WCH 2013



In accordance of the number of active federations in men canoe category Europe and America participation in the World Championships acceptable but the other continents should increase their participations.

The ICF want to be proactive for securing canoe events existence in the Olympic Games from 2020 and decided some measurements for canoe category development at the Canoe Summit in 2014.

As a result of the discussions the following measures were taken:

- **Organisation of special Canoe Coach's Courses at each Continent**  
It was organized in Morocco for Africa at May 2014 and under organization in the other continents
- **Introducing the mentoring programme. The best 16 national federations in canoe category were requested for support weaker federations in canoe.** HUN, CAN and ROM already took some actions.
- **Equipment donation for new or poor federations in canoe have been realized**
- **Priority of support of canoe athletes application to the TIP from 2014**

### 4. Coach's Education

The ICF Coach's education structure established from 2010:

**Level 1:** "ASSISTANT COACH" for beginner coaches.

**Level 2:** "ADVANCED COACH" for experienced coaches



**Level 3: “EXPERT COACH”** is the highest leveled course for national coaches under the ICF’ organisation with the involvement of the Semmelweis University in Budapest /Hungary.

## 5. Logistical and financial support for various canoeing events

#### 6.1 Domestic Boat Production Project(NEW PROJECT in DP!)

The Project entails is providing the opportunity for good quality and cheap domestic boats production for training and local competitions.

**With the agreement of NELO Co. the ICF introduces and support financially the domestic boat manufacturing in developing NFs.**

**Objective:** The Package contains Moulds, Raw Materials, Paddles, Transportation and passing high level Technological skills to manufacture of 60



Canoe- Sprint Kayaks and Canoes per country. Later National Federations produce more boats in the future through training of manpower and become self sufficient in providing canoes and kayaks boats for grass roots development of sports

The financial component of the project is about 22.000 Euros shared out equally by NELO, ICF /CAC and National federation.

The first project started already in Puerto Rico and Tunisia. The next will be in Sudan then Morocco.

## 7. DEVELOPMENT OF PARACANOEING

The Paracanoeing Budget was a part of the ICF Development Programme Budget in order to secure the minimum 25 participating NFs at the World Championships. The ICF organized and supported athletes who attended in the WChs from 2010.

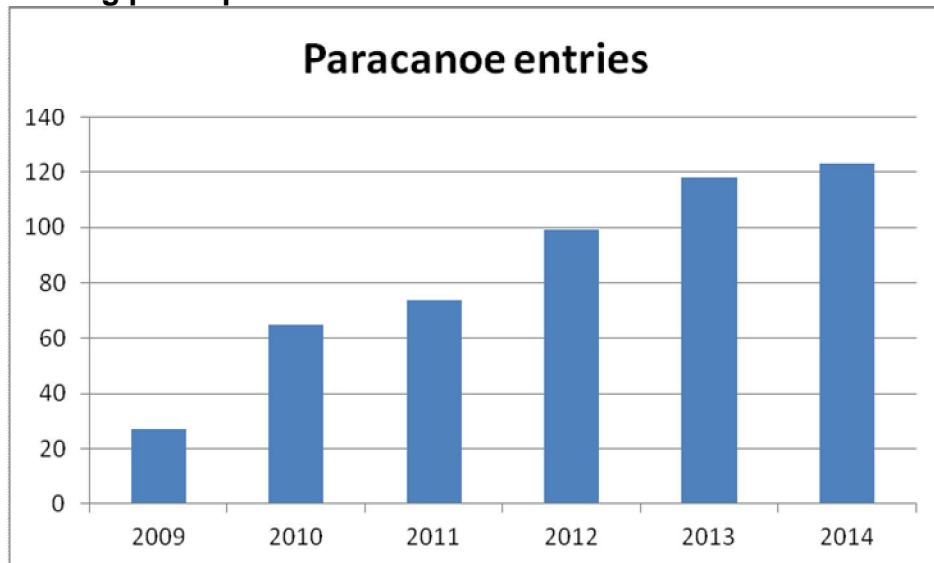

#### **Paracanoeing participation in the WChs**



#### **The Pan American Canoe Confederation established of a Paracanoe Commission its last Congress 2013 for:**

- Formalize a link with the ICF Canoeing for All Committee to ensure consistent approaches and shared communication
- Establish a COPAC Directory of Classifiers which will filter into a process for classifier assignment for events and training needs
- Share information and collaborate with peer facilitators to ensure a streamlined approach for training.
- Include targeted facilitators in training at each education session to broaden the number of individuals who can offer training and meet those standards.

#### **8. The execution of the DP required the following tasks for the manager:**

- The Report and the Plans for Development Programme with its Budget prepared for each 2 years period and approved by the ICF Continental Representatives, Board of Directors and ICF Congress
- All phases and details of the DP are discussed and approved by the Mr. Vaskuti
- Applications for the IOC' financial support and Reports on the executed programme in the TIP were made yearly



- All the planned projects were organized in the reported periods as: TIP, Women Canoe Cup, Coach's Courses, Domestic Boat Building, Education programme, Events' support, Mentoring Programme, courses and seminars were organized and conducted etc
- Constant correspondences with the Continental Associations, national federations etc. Organising Committee of the various Events, host national federations, equipment manufacturers and etc.
- Personal negotiations and written agreements were made with the host NFs of the various events regarding the responsibilities of providing logistical and financial support
- The organization of all projects in the DP required a lot of administrations and correspondences for example: releasing information on the programme, collecting applications, selections to the inclusion to the programme, supporting visa issues, collecting travelling schedules and boat demands; working on its financial issues, payment arrangements etc. In addition keeping the records of the performance of the selected athletes in the TIP monthly.
- Establishing the "Memorandum of Understanding" document with the host of TIP for clarify the responsibilities of lodge/food, transportation, duty and custom clearing at equipment donation,
- Coordinate the domestic boat producing projects between the benefited National Federations, ICF and NELO
- Supporting the organization of Paracanoeing development programme,
- Following the financial issues, accounting of the CSP expenses and payments for travelling expenses etc.
- Published Coach's Handbook for CSP Level2/3.

## **9. INFORMATION ON THE BUDGET**

**THE DEVELOPMENT OVERALL ICF BUDGET FOR 2012-14 WAS 680.000 Euros equally divided between CSP and CSL.**

**The established Budget covered the reported projects with the IOC and Olympic Solidarity financial support in addition with the listed support by the host national federations of the TIPs and the equipment manufacturers.**



## **10 CONCLUSION OF THE ICF CSP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME 2012- 14**

**It's clear that the developing and financial poor federations without the ICF financial and logistical support wouldn't be able progressing considerably in consideration with their financial surceases, background and the short tradition in canoeing!**

**The number of national federation participation in the World Championships would be less by about 15-20 countries without the organization of Talent Identification programme!**

The entire planned programme for the reported period was fulfilled successfully within the available Budget.

The amount of the DP's Budget did not increase in the past 10 years, which determinates the possible supports in this frame!

The ICF Continental Representatives and the Continental Associations are an integral component for the ICF Development Programme!

The allocated amount in the DP direct to the Continental Association is a good concept as provides them more authority for selection of the supporting projects.

The evaluation of the National Federations' activity and progressing is important for their further support in the DP!

The evaluation of the athlete's performance and progressing under the DP must be followed in consideration with further support!



## **PLANS FOR 2014-2016**

**The main target of the ICF Development Programme is to assist to the most needed member federations for their faster progressing in canoeing.**

**The aim is to decreasing the gap between the elite and developing athletes' standard with higher technical level, faster speed, better performance, equipment and supported participation in training camps and competitions. The targeting achievement requires the development of coaches knowledge as well!**

### **THE PRINCIPAL TARGETS OF THE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME 2014-2016**

- **The continuity of the Talent Identification Programme (TIP)**
- **The continuity of the Coaches' Education Programme by organizing technical courses and seminars at various levels. Also support financially 8 selected coach attendance in the Level 3 Course in 2015.**
- **Support the development of the Women's and Men Canoe category and their participation in National, Continental and World Events**
- **Support the domestic boat productions logistically and financially**
- **Provide logistical and financial support to host National Federations and/or organizers of Canoeing Games and/or Championships**
- **Support the special development targets of the Continental Associations**
- **Support the development of Paracanoeing by encouraging the participation of Paracanoeists at National, Continental and World Events, as preparation towards the 2016 Rio Paralympics Games**
