

Muotatal, the Muota Valley, situated in the region Stoos-Muotatal, represents nature, primeval character and tradition. And thanks to the Muota, the river giving the valley it's name, it also represents whitewater racing.

The river meanders over 30 km through cantons Uri and Schwyz to its mouth in the Vierwaldstättersee (Lake Lucerne) in Brunnen.

The Muota River is ideal for whitewater racing, and has already proven its worthiness with the 1973 Canoe World Championships, and the 2015 Swiss Championships being held on its waters.

The town Muotathal is an aspiring community which places great value on both tradition and innovation. The Wetterschmöcker (traditional weather forcasters famous all over Switzerland) and the Höllloch cave system are just two of the local specialities that the area can offer. The Muotataler Alp Cheese Market, taking place at the end of October, has, since it's start, developed into a huge event, drawing crowds from over Switzerland and Europe.

By the way, "Muotatal" without the H is the valley, and "Muotathal" with the H is the town.

Muotathal is situated in the heart of Switzerland and is easy to reach by car.

From Basel or Lucerne:

From Lucerne follow the A14 motorway towards Zug. After 20 km you will arrive at the "Rütihof" three-way motorway intersection. Here follow the A4 motorway towards Schwyz. Leave the motorway at Schwyz and follow the signs to Muotathal.

From Lake Constance and Rapperswil:

From Rapperswil head towards Pfäffikon / Gotthard. At Pfäffikon follow the A3 motorway a short distance towards Gotthard. Take the first exit towards Gotthard / Schwyz. A rural road then takes you past Rothenthurm and Sattel to Schwyz. In Schwyz travel towards Muotathal.

From Gotthard / Altdorf:

In Flüelen take the bypass tunnel towards Schwyz. After the Mositunnel tunnel, exit the motorway at exit 40 (towards Weggis / Gersau / Schwyz / Brunnen). Drive towards Ibach / Schwyz and take the first exit towards Muotathal at the second roundabout (near Dany's Family Restaurant).

The normal scale of river difficulty for the Muota is WW II +, with a WW III section around the Muotastein (the name given to a large stone in the middle of the river) which is part of the sprint leg.

All important information about the route is available in the Internet on the WM Muota 2018 homepage.

Also available on Internet is information about water levels and scale of river difficulty. There is also a film about various parts of the paddle route, as well as photos of the put-in and take-out points.



Alternative race venue on the Urner Reuss River from Amsteg to Erstfeld

It was decided, along with the ICF, that an alternative venue for the World Championship 2018 would be defined.

If water levels exceed 60m3/s, the ICF Technical Delegation, in conjunction with the Chief Judge, the race Technical Organiser and the Head of Safety will jointly decide whether the race should continue to be held on the Muota or whether, for safety reasons, the race should be transferred to the Urner Reuss.

The alternative venue is located near Erstfeld, approximately 40 km from the town of Muotathal. The competition course can be reached by car in approximately 40 minutes. Further details about the various legs of the the Urner Reuss and pictures of the put-in and take-out points are available on the WM Muota 2018 homepage.



New put-in and take-out rules for paddlers on the Muota

Working together with land owners, farmers, and the municipal council, it was decided that from spring 2017 an official set of rules related to put-in and take-out should be followed. The aim of these rules is to keep the impact of paddlers and events on the farming land bordering the Muota River to a minimum.

This includes official put-in and take-out sites, which have been identified with signs, where kayaks and other water vessels can enter and exit the water. It also includes signs where take-out is strictly forbidden, except in the event of an emergency. At all other places along the river it is forbidden to put-in or take-out and any infringement of these rules can result in a fine.

We ask that all paddlers respect and follow these rules. Many thanks in advance.

Put-in "Balm", Start Classic

Near the put-in for the classic race there are plenty of carparks on the gravel area near the football pitch, as well as along the main road above the put-in.

Put-in and take-out "Rambach", Start Sprint

At the put-in and take-out point at Rambach there is no carparking on the gravel area beside the road. This gravel area is only for loading or unloading of boats. Parking is on the carpark 200 meters up the road. The gravel area at Rambach must at all times be hinderance free to enable access for the business operators.

Users of the carpark further up the road should also keep access unhindered to enable free access for the operating company to the rubbish depot.

Take-out point "Vorderbrücke", Finish classic and sprint

Here there is no carpark available. Boats must be carried up the left bank to the gravel area for the put-in/take-out point at Rambach.

Due to the fact that the main road between Vorder Brugg and Rambach is in a rural zone, it is not permitted to park on the pavement. If you break this rule, you will recieve a hefty fine from the police.

Take-out point "Selgis"

200 meters up the main road from the Selgis take-out point you will find plenty of carparking on the gravel area to the right.

All details, including pictures of the carparking available around the venue, can be found on the Kanu WM 2018 homepage.

We kindly ask you to adhere to the rules governing the current carparking situation.



During the World Championships, from Friday 25 May to Sunday 3 June, a special car park for accredited competitors only will be available on the righthand side of the river downstream of the Vordere Brücke. The car park gives direct access to the river downstream of the finish.

This car park is reserved primarily for minibuses with trailers. So long as space is available, other vehicles may also use the car park for loading boats. If there is insufficient space, in particular during the sprint races on Saturday and Sunday, only minibuses with trailers will be allowed access. All other vehicles will have to use the second car park 200m upstream of the Rambach access/egress point.





Throughout the region of Muotathal and neighbouring Illgau there are a variety of hotels, holiday apartments and guesthouses available. We advise you to make your own arrangements by contacting the options listed. Further information about the various accomodation options can be found by visiting their websites or by telephone. Alternatively, the team at the Stoos-Muotatal Tourism Office will be glad to help you in your search. We advise you to make your bookings soon. Please mention that you are booking for the Canoe World Championships because some accomodation has already been set aside for our needs.

At the "Erlebniswelt Muotathal" near the start zone there is a small camping area for tents which offers electricity and showers. Please contact the Erlebniswelt directly on +41 (0)41 831 81 50.

Overnight camping accommodation will also be available mid-way along the course, near the entrance to the village of Muotathal.

Running water and showers will be provided on site. Electric hook-ups for mobile homes and camper vans will be available as will charging points for mobile phones computers and tablets.

Visas for foreign nationals can be issued by the Swiss representation covering their place of residence. Basically, there are two types of visa. Both can be applied for by completing a visa application form submitted in good time.

Since Switzerland's adherence to the Schengen and Dublin agreements came into force (12 December 2008) Swiss representations abroad are able to issue particularly two types of visa, depending on the purpose of the proposed stay:

- Schengen Visa, type C: for entry and a stay of up to 90 days within a period of 180 days, for example in the context of tourism, a visit, short-term language studies, etc.
 For a stay involving gainful employment a work permit is also required.
- National visa, also known as type D: for longer term stays in Switzerland (more than 90 days). This visa is issued subject to authorisation from the cantonal migration authority competent for the intended place of residence in Switzerland.

The application must be submitted in good time: depending on the time of year/type of visa, the process can take several weeks or even months. For a Schengen visa, the visa application can be submitted no earlier than three months before the planned entry into the Schengen area. The documents which must be submitted along with the visa application as well as the procedure differ depending on the applicant's country of residence. 
Safety

Each participant takes part at his/her own risk.

Safety during training sessions are the responsibility of each team coach. Wildwater rescue will only be guaranteed during competition. Each competitor must follow the safety rules according to the ICF Wildwater Canoeing Rules (helmet, buoyancy jacket, shoes, airbags...).

Medical Services

The following medical services are available for all official participants of the World Cup during the competition days: doctor on duty, hospital and clinic assistance. A medical centre will operate at the sprint course in the finish area with ambulance and first aid. The costs above the regular first aid and ambulance services are to be covered by your own medical insurance policy. The Organizing Committee is not responsible to cover your expenses in connection with hospital treatment, dental treatment or any other medical treatment.

How to register?

You need to enter your team through "nominal entries" via the ICF software SDP in order to validate them. With the nominal entries, all athletes will be automatically pre-accreditated, so you do not need to reenter them.

Please note, you need to enter all your staff members through preaccreditations!

The Masters Race

Date: 31 May 2018, 14:00 to 16:00

Course: Classic distance from Hinterthal to Vorderbrücke, 4.3 km

Registration: Registration is to be submitted via the National Federation, using the form available on the homepage www.wm-muota2018.ch. To download the form go to the tab "Athlete Info". Completed forms should be sent by email to: wmmuota2018@bluewin.ch and referenced "Masters Registration" There is no limit to the number of entries per category.

Categories: Age groups A (35-39 years); B (40-44 years); C (45-49 years); D (50-54 years); E (55-59 years); F (> 60 years)
Categories: C1 Ladies and Men, C2 Ladies and Men, K1 Ladies and Men

Registration close: Registration closes 17 May 2018

Accreditation fees: No accreditation fees are payable. The entry fee is €60.- per boat which includes entry to the closing party in Muotathal on Sunday evening.

Payment: Payment must be made in advance by the National Federation by bank transfer before **25 May 2018**. The bank details are available on **page 18** of this bulletin.

Start numbers: The start numbers for the Masters races will be issued to the team representatives on Thursday morning, at the officially designated time.

Safety: The safety regulations are as per official World Championship regulations (see page 17).

Awards Ceremony: The awards ceremony for the Masters Classic Race will be held at **20:00 on 31 May 2018** at Muotathal School.



Catering for athletes

We will be able to offer inexpensive catering arrangements for athletes and other team members in the finish area on race days.

From Wednesday evening to Sunday evening the catering arrangements for volunteers will also be opened to athletes and other team members at lunch time and in the evening.


Meals cost CHF 13.00/€13.00, which includes unlimited non-alcoholic drinks.

Every day soup and bread with unlimited non-alcoholic drinks will be available for CHF $6.00/ \in 6.00$.

The menu is still being prepared and will be published later on the internet.

We would ask interested teams to contact us in advance in order to gauge the interest in this possibility. Please therefore contact Peter as soon as possible by email on wmmuota2018@bluewin.ch.

The actual number of meals required can be ordered 2 days in advance from the main office. The requested number of meal vouchers will then be issued on the appropriate day by the office upon receipt of payment.





Spectator Access

Arrival by car:

Spectators arriving by car have a choice of 5 car parks along the road leading into the Mutoathal valley.

Car parks P1 to P4 are free, clearly signed and staffed by our team of volunteers.

The car parks with spaces available at any time are indicated on a large roadside sign. It is strongly recommended not to proceed beyond the indicated official carpark as there are no other car parks available further up the valley.

Carpark P5 is a reserve car park only. This is the official public car park of the Stoosbahnen AG funicular and can be used only if the appropriate parking fee is paid.

On competition days a regular shuttle bus service will run from all car parks to the competition arena near the race finish.

Please note:

The parking areas are not monitored. Stoosbahnen and the organisers of the ICF Canoe World Cup accept no liability in the event of any incident.

Parking is very limited. For this reason it is essential to use public transport when attending the races in Muotathal.

Arrival by Public Transport:

A half-hourly bus service runs from Schwyz railway station to Muotathal (Bus no. 1, Arth Goldau - Lauerz - Schwyz – Muotathal). The journey time is 24 minutes. Get off at the Ried, Vordere Brücke stop, which is at the race finish.




Important Safety Information

Approximately 200m downstream from the Kanu Arena, below the finish bridge and the official get-out at the "Vordere Brücke", is the shooting range of the Muotathal Shooting Club. The line of sight of the range crosses directly over the Muota River, the stand being on the right hand side and the targets being on the left hand side.

During official shooting events there is a serious danger to life if you attempt to exit the river in this area. The river can, however, be paddled safely at all times.

If the range is in use during race training, it is strictly forbidden to exit the river within a safety zone of 100m upstream and 100m downstream of the range line of sight.
