## LOCATION & ACCESSIBILITY

### *GENERAL INFORMATION ON HUNGARY*

Population: 9.6 million

Area: 93.036 km<sup>2</sup>

Capital: Budapest (Territory: 525 km<sup>2</sup>)

Hungary is a landlocked country in Central Europe surrounded by Slovakia, Ukraine, Romania, Serbia, Croatia, Slovenia and Austria. The Danube River forms part of Hungary's north-western border with Slovakia, and then flows south through Budapest, dividing Hungary into two general regions. A low, rolling plain known as the Great Hungarian Plain, covers most of the region east of the Danube extending east to Romania and south to Serbia. Hungary has a continental climate with cold, cloudy, humid winters and warm to hot summers.



## DUNAREMETE

Dunaremete is a small village on the Slovak border with a population of just 259. Despite its size, it is home to Hungary's first slalom course, located on a man-made Danube channel. The course is regulated by a dam and fully separated from both commercial boat traffic and floodwaters of the main Danube, ensuring safe and controlled water conditions for competition.

The Dunaremete Slalom Course (Sorjási-bukó) is situated approximately 1 km outside the village, next to the ferry house within a protected National Park area. Due to its location, official permission to organize competitions must be requested at least 30 days in advance. While the area hosts some canoe tourism, the sprint section of the course remains a restricted zone. Typical weather conditions in June range between 25–35°C, with flat terrain and occasional windy conditions.

The venue is located 3.3 km (approximately a 7-minute drive) from Lipót, a nearby village with 798 residents. Lipót offers a well-developed tourism infrastructure, including a popular thermal spa, restaurants, small shops, a bakery, and several hotels. The nearest major town is Mosonmagyaróvár, just 15 km away (around 20 minutes by car), with a population of nearly 35,000 and comprehensive services such as hotels, shopping centers, banks, and entertainment facilities.





Győr, the regional capital with approximately 130,000 inhabitants, is located 29 km from Dunaremete (around a 30-minute drive). As a university city, Győr offers a vibrant cultural life with festivals and concerts and has extensive experience in hosting international sporting events, including the Canoe Marathon World Championships. The Győr Canoe Club—Hungary's first club to introduce slalom and wildwater paddling—manages the Dunaremete course and operates the riverside facilities.

The Dunaremete Slalom Course was completed in May 2025. Since then, several slalom competitions have been successfully organized at the venue, including events with international participation. However, a downriver (wildwater) race has never been held on this course before, making the 2026 ICF Wildwater Canoeing World Cup a historic milestone for both the venue and the development of the discipline in Hungary.







## HOW TO GET THERE

Arrival by car is possible via the main road network, with direct navigation available through Google Maps to the Dunaremete Slalom Course (Sorjási-bukó).

International arrival by air can be arranged via Vienna International Airport (approximately 1 hour 6 minutes by car) or Bratislava Airport (approximately 57 minutes by car). Both airports are well connected to major cities by train and bus services. Long-distance travel between major cities is commonly provided by operators such as FlixBus and Telekocsi.



From Mosonmagyaróvár or Győr, access to Dunaremete is available via local bus services only, including routes 3, 45, and 89.

To support participation from developing countries, limited boat transportation from the Banja Luka World Championships will be provided, subject to availability. ## VISA

**All participants and officials requiring a visa to enter the Hungary must follow the official process outlined the National authorities.**

Participants are encouraged to reach out to the Hungarian Embassy or consulate in their country or the nearest one, well in advance to inquire about visa requirements. The process of obtaining a visa for Hungary can vary depending on the region, so it is advisable to allow for a 45-day processing period to secure the visa in time.

### **THE TYPICAL STEPS FOR OBTAINING A VISA ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

- 1.** Email your visa request to [wildwater2026@dunaremete.com](mailto:wildwater2026@dunaremete.com) to receive the Visa Application Form.
- 2.** Send the completed Visa Application Form to the HOC by 7 April 2026.
- 3.** The OC issues the Letter of Invitation contacting the Hungarian Embassy / Consulate serving in your country / territory and do the paperwork they request from you.
- 4.** Visa issuance

Please be informed that the OC will not issue an invitation letter without knowing your team's arrival and departure dates, accommodation details, the number of participants and their identities. If final team selection is pending, a long list of all potential athletes and officials may be submitted to avoid delays.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Hungary and the respective embassy or consulate require the same information from us; therefore, we cannot support your request without your cooperation in providing this information by 7 April 2026.

## TRAINING

Training on the course is available throughout the year. Training sessions can be requested via email, subject to availability and scheduling confirmation. A detailed training schedule will be published and made available online. Official pre-World Cup training days will begin on Friday, 29 May 2026. ## THE COURSE

### *Sprint Course*

The sprint course will be located on the slalom course. The start will be above on the flatwater, have to cross under the bridge and go through 120 m long and 56 m wide slalom course with 1,5 m drop about 100 m<sup>3</sup>/sec. The sprint will be 245 m long WWI-II. Entry to the water is possible on the left side of the river in a small harbor above the start. Exit from the course is possible either river right on the ramp or river left on stairs. On trainings it is possible to use the stairs and the small harbor around the bridge for entry to the river and paddle up to the start.

The classic course is started at the Kisbodak Szent Kristóf Bridge and is finished at the end of the sprint course, with a total length of 4.9 km and an approximate duration of 15 minutes (WW I). The course is characterized by two small drops and a 120 m slalom section, separated by stretches of flatwater. The overall drop of the course is about 2 m.

All official participants of the World Cup are strongly advised to take out a medical insurance policy in their respective countries.

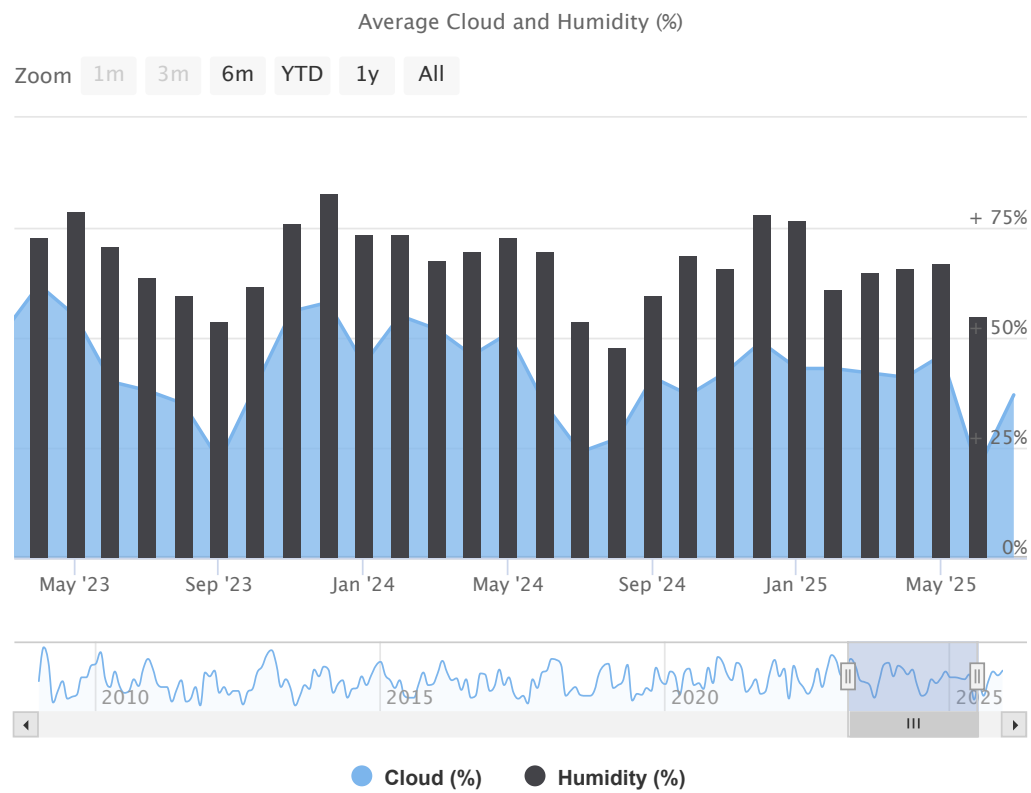
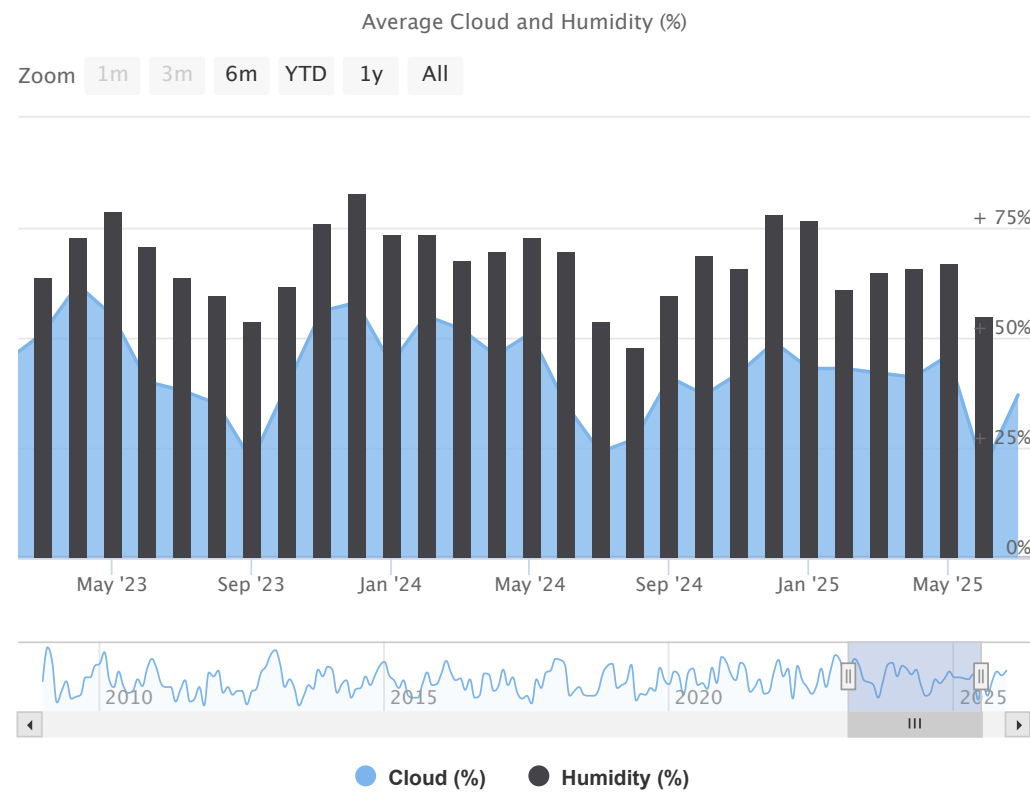
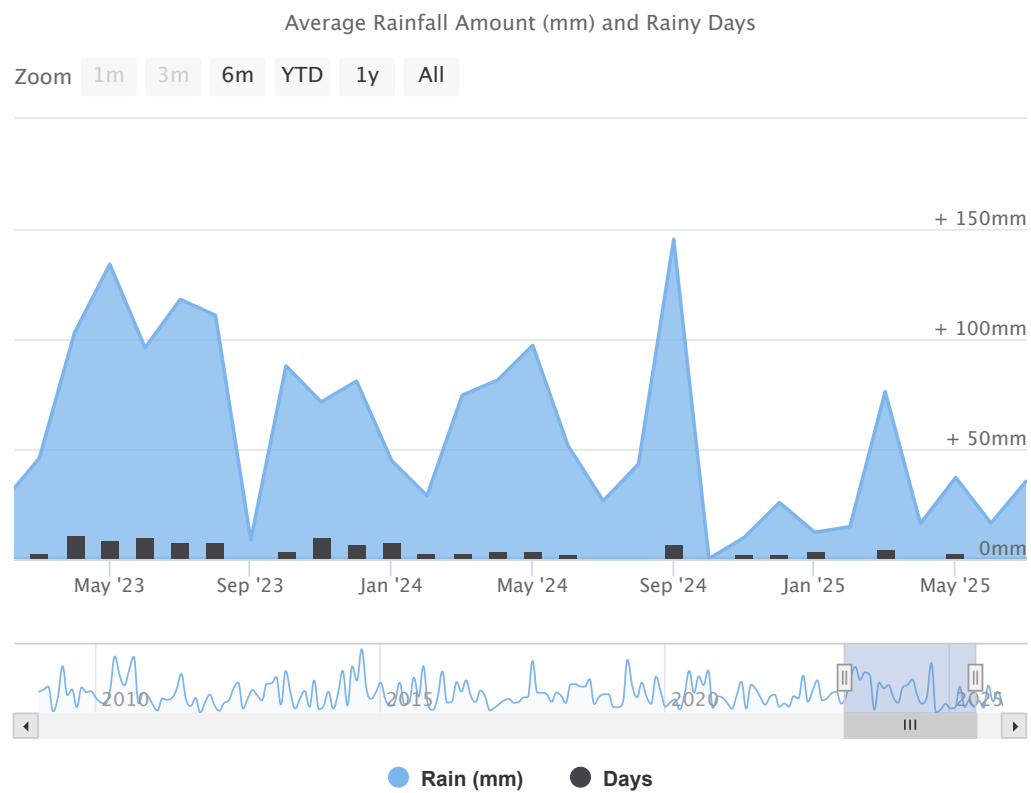
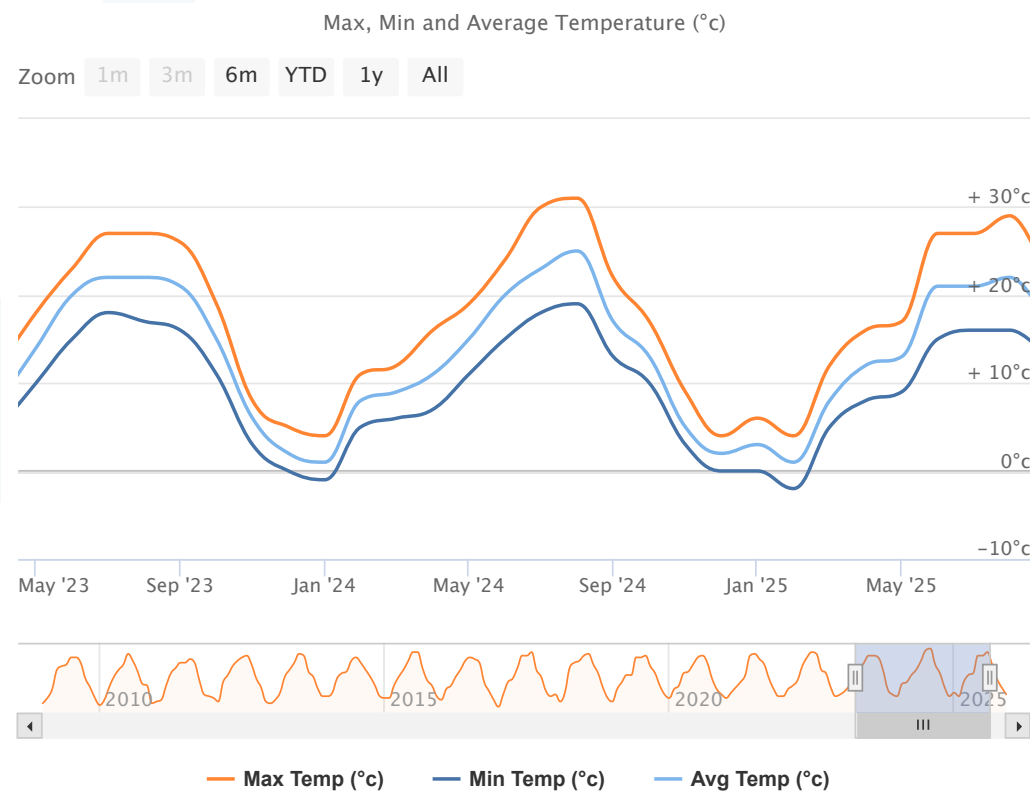
### MEDICAL CARE
