Dear sports friends, please find below the last information before the start of the official training on Monday 22 august 22.

ENTRY INTO FRANCE AND LOCAL COVID 19 POLICIES

Since the 9th April 2022, the protective measures regarding the conditions of entry into France in relation to the epidemic of covid-19 have been suspended. Entry into France is no longer subject to any special epidemiological conditions to prevent the spread of the disease.

All Covid-19 protective measures in the France were lifted.

ICF 2022 COVID 19 PROTOCOL

Even if the local protocols have been minimized in France, people involved in ICF events are required to follow the 2022 ICF Covid Protocol . Most important topics of this protocol are listed below

Responsibility

The national federations (NF) are responsible of their own risk assessment and for all costs associated with Covid-19 testing. They appoint a COVID-19 Manager in their workforce.

The NF Covid-19 Manager is responsible for ensuring that all team personnel have read the Health Check forms (appendix 2 of the 2022 COVID-19 protocol) and abided by their contents, prior to signing the COVID-19 Consent Form.

To be accredited in a competition a person is required to:

- Have had a negative Covid test within the 24 hours prior to entering the venue. It can be Rapid Self-test, Rapid PoC, PCR, NAATs tests. No evidence is needed to be accredited.
Remark: During long official training or competition period (> 3 days), the ICF medical committee recommends to keep self-testing every three days
- Accept to follow the 2022 ICF COVID-19 protocol guide (symptoms tracking and participant instructions)

Acceptance of these principles are recorded by the host organizing committee which collect either a [Personal Health Check Information Form](#) (for individuals like ITOs, HOC staff) or a [COVID 19 Consent Form](#) (for whole team).

The ICF or HOC does not accept any responsibility for COVID-19 infection that occurs before, during or after the competition. The ICF and HOC appoint a COVID-19 Managers in their workforce.

Personal Equipment and safety measures

During travel time and at the competition venue, participants must:

- Wear a mask indoors and in crowded places
- Frequently ventilate indoor spaces
- Avoid close contacts such as handshakes and hugging (e.g., award ceremony)



Wash hands regularly and sanitise contact points

Process for a Positive Test or Suspicion

- Case report to the HOC COVID-19 and the ICF COVID managers. Assessment of needed actions with local health authorities & ICF medical committee.
- Immediate isolation and testing for the whole team and for all close contacts.
- All close contacts must be tested and if negative, athlete/staff/organizer can compete or work but will be restricted to minimal movements.
- If a further positive case occurs outside of the index case close contact in one team or group, the whole team/group may need to be isolated and quarantined until results of further rapid antigen testing are known
- All expenses for isolation or needed quarantine must be paid by the concerned entity

ACCESS TO THE VENUE AND THE ACCREDITATION

Accreditation passes will be required to access the venue, from Thursday 25/08 at 08 :00 AM.

Accreditation Office will be open from Tuesday 23/08 at 09:00 AM.

Please make sure you have documents listed below ready in order to receive the accreditation:

- Accreditation fee: 115 EUR per team member. The payment can be made only by cash at the accreditation office upon your arrival. If you arranged with us the payment by bank transfer, please bring the transfer receipt/proof..
- [Personal Health Check Information Form](#) for each team member or [NF Covid Consent](#) for whole team.
- [Carbon Footprint Google Form](#) filled in for all team members or individually (see below Carbon Footprint paragraph)

OFFICIAL TRAINING AND BIBS

Official training before the competition will be possible only with training bibs and according to this [Training Schedule](#)

Please pick up your training bibs prior to your first training session at the Team Leader Area (Terrasse). There is no deposit required for training bibs but in order to receive competition bibs you must return all training bibs or pay 25€ for each unreturned bib.

ATHLETES' SERVICES

Athletes' lounge will provide snacks and drinks.

Teams are welcome to **Pau Caliceo balneotherapy** (swimming pool, hammam, sauna) receiving free entries during the week of competition, from August 22nd to 28th : Tickets for free entries must be collected at the accreditations area from August 22. The center is located 15 minutes away from the whitewater stadium by car.

Waste: This year, a waste recovery center will be set up in the athletes' village and another on the island. We ask you to have particular attention to respect selective sorting. You will have guides to help you at the reception of the athletes' village in case of doubt.

How to reduce your waste? Take your water bottle! A water fountain will be at the entrance to the athletes' village.

Bikes are available free of charge to athletes during the competition, from Monday August 22 to Sunday August 28.

How to book a bike:

- Appointment, from Monday August 22 afternoon at the transport service
- A deposit will be required – identity document, ...
- You are responsible for your bike throughout the competition
- In the event of loss, breakage or theft, compensation is your responsibility
- A padlock will be provided with your bike
- A bicycle parking lot will be positioned in front of the whitewater stadium, at the accredited entrance
- You will have to return your bike from Saturday afternoon on the time slot indicated on the questionnaire
