2019 ECA PARACANOE EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The 2019 European Championships will be help in combination with the 2019 ICF World Cup in Poznan.

2019 PARACANOE PARALYMPIC TEST EVENT:

The Paralympic Test Event will be help in Tokyo on 12 - 15 September 2019. Each available slot, for each category, will be proposed to National Federation through invitation, based on the 2018 Paracanoe World Championships.

The invitation will be published through the Bulletin #1 for the Canoe Sprint & Para Test Event for Tokyo 2020

The national federation must respond by end 15 April 2019.

After that, the remaining unused slots will be reallocated. Remaining slot may also be reallocating based on the 2019 World Cup results.

There will not be any classification at the Paracanoe Paralympic Test Event. The athletes will need to have an attributed eligible sport class before the competition.

PARACANOE PARALYMPIC QUALIFICATION SYSTEM

ATHLETE CLASSIFICATION

Paracanoe Kayak athletes: KL1 / KL2 / KL3 / VL1 / VL2 / VL3

Athletes with one of the following statuses are required to pass the classification before the competition:

- REVIEW Status with a Fixed Review Date before the Competition
- REVIEW Status or
- New Status

Schedule Classification Slot - Important

For the athletes with a Status requiring Classification, a classification slot must be booked in advance through the doodle. Please be aware that the doodle will be open only for 2 weeks.

Since 2019, it will only be possible to choose a preferred date for classification.

The detailed schedule will be communicated to each Team Leader / NF / NPC a few days after the classification pool has closed.

There is no possibility to choose the exact time of the classification.

If an athlete fails to attend his/her classification slot, he/she will not be classified and will not be permitted to race.

PLEASE NOTE: Athletes and all their equipment are expected to be present for the entire Classification Period. Athletes must be classified separately for Kayak and Va'a.

Platform for sending classification documents:

The Classification platform has to be used for sending documents to the ICF Classifiers. No document should be sent by email or any other form

This platform allows to have a more secure transfer of documents, as well as a secured storage. It is compliant with the IPC code on data protection matters.

- All mandatory documents should be uploaded on this platform before the specific deadline.
- An access will be required for log-in to the system. If you need a new access, please send an email to classification@canoeicf.com
- The preferred format for all documents is PDF

ANTI-DOPING EDUCATION

For the World Cups and World Championships, every Paracanoe athlete must pass the anti-doping online course. The course can be accessed here: https://www.canoeicf.com/anti-doping-education

The Athlete Learning Program about Health and Anti-Doping (ALPHA) gives athletes information about the dangers of doping, the importance of anti-doping controls and promotes positive attitudes to avoiding doping.

It consists of eight sessions and takes two hours to complete. Athletes are encouraged to take the course in several stages. Progress is then saved from one visit to another. A pre- and post-course anti-doping knowledge test and attitude survey is included to evaluate the effectiveness of the program.

A score of 80% or higher is required for ALPHA certification, though athletes with insufficient scores are able to repeat the program. Those who have completed the programme in previous years do not need to redo it.

Please enter the correct identity information while creating an account, as the completion of the course will be recorded.



REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR CLASSIFICATION

Athletes attending classification at competitions must upload the following Paracanoe forms on the *Classification upload platform* before the classification period, with the following deadlines:

No later than 30 days before the start of the classification period of the Competition (unless otherwise indicated):

- Paracanoe Athlete Certificate of Diagnosis
- · Athlete Diagnosis Form
- Any other supporting medical documentation

No later than 3 weeks before the event:

- Declaration of Medical Complications & Emergency Measures
- Paracanoe Athlete Information & Consent
- Strapping waiver this document will be valid for the whole 2019 season
- PFD waiver this document will be valid for the whole 2019 season

No later than 3 days before the event or before the classification:

- Equipment passport for Kayak if the athlete competes in a Kayak category
- Equipment passport for Va'a if the athlete competes in a Va'a category

All documents must be completed in English.

Athlete Certificate of Diagnosis must be completed in English and signed by a medical doctor. It should also include supporting medical diagnostic documentation. <u>In complex cases additional supporting medical information may be requested.</u>

Any athlete who is entered in an event for which he/she has no classification will not be permitted to race.

Paracanoe athletes may enter more than one event if their classification makes them eligible to do so and the schedule permits. (NOTE: Athletes are not permitted to compete outside their classification category, ie. A KL1 category athlete may not race 'up' into KL2)

NF's are required to provide their own boats for their classification. The ICF is unable to provide a boat loan service. It is recommended that Federations who need to borrow boats for the competition or for classification make boat loan arrangements early with boat manufacturers or event organizers.



EQUIPMENT PASSPORT

<u>ALL</u> athletes competing MUST complete and upload an equipment passport on the *classification* upload platform.

If the equipment passports are not completed and uploaded, the athlete will not be allowed to race. The equipment passports will be checked during classification and before each race. If the equipment does not match the equipment passports, the athlete will not be allowed to race.

If the athlete has sent an equipment passport before but has changed some equipment, a new equipment passport must be uploaded on the *classification upload platform* and the changes must be specified.

If the athlete has been given a confirmed status and are changing the equipment, the Chief Classifier will determine if the changes are approved.

NOTABLE RULES for PARACANOE

(see Paracanoe Rulebook & Classification Rules for exact wording.)

A 50 euro fee per athlete will be charged for incomplete forms that require the ICF Paracanoe Committee to complete.

A 20 euros fee will be charge for every late entry, under the condition that the entry is accepted by the Paracanoe Committee.

A 200 euro fee must accompany each Protest of a Classification.

A 75 euro fee must accompany each Protest of a Competition Rule National Federations are permitted two entries in all Paracanoe events.

NOMINAL ENTRIES DUE DATE: 10 days before the first day of the classification.

Athletes are only permitted to race in the class in which they are classified; i.e. A KL1 category athlete can only race in KL1.

Spray skirts/Spray decks are not permitted for Paracanoe classification or Paracanoe races unless approved by the Chief Official due to inclement weather conditions. Kayaks are only permitted to have one rudder under the hull. Hence, skegs and/or projecting keels are not permitted. Rudders may be fixed.

Kayaks will be allowed weed deflectors in front of the rudder.

Only stabilizing pontoons are permitted as modifications for stability. Va'a hulls are permitted to be concave. Rudders, skegs and projecting keels are not permitted.

TALENT IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM

The ICF will run a Paracanoe Talent ID camp prior to the Poznan World Cup and the Szeged World Championships.

The camps will focus on priorities for development within Paracanoe. In order to build participant numbers for the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games, five spaces are reserved for women paracanoe athletes who are eligible for the VL2 category. Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- must not have competed in the 2018 World Championships
- be classified as a VL2 athlete, or
- have submitted classification documents to the Head of Classification to assess and preliminary assess a VL2 category
- endorsement by the athlete's National Federation.
- submit application to Jean-Christophe GONNEAUD by March 22: jcgonneaud@ffck.org

The camp prior to the Poznan World Cup will be in Hungary at the Dunavarsy Training Centre near Budapest from May 13 to 17 and will include travel to Poznan. All on-site local expenses for accommodation, board and local airport pickup are covered by the Hungarian Canoe Federation. ICF Paracanoe will offer financial support up to €700 toward travel and competition costs in Poznan. Any additional costs are the responsibility of the National Federation.

NOTE: Official athlete classification will occur at the Poznan World Cup and the World Championships. The World Championships in August are the first qualifying event for the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games. The be eligible to qualify an athlete position for a National Paralympic Committee, the athlete must have an eligible Status of "Confirmed" or "Review with Fixed Date" with the date after the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.

A separate announcement will be made for the selection process to the TID Camp to precede the World Championships in Szeged in August.
