6. Start list distribution

CLASSIC and SPRINT (Heats)

The start lists for the **classic individual** heat will be uploaded to the WhatsApp group on Tuesday, 13.08.2024 at 12:00. Printed copy must be requested at the Team Leader Meeting (2 max per nation)

After the classic individual race, the **team race start list** will be uploaded to the WhatsApp group on Wednesday, 14.08.2023 at 20:00. Printed copy must be requested at the Team Leader Meeting (2 max per nation)

SPRINT

The start lists for the **1**st **and 2**nd **qualification** heat will be uploaded to the WhatsApp group on Thursday, 15.08.2024 at 12:00. The starting order for sprint heats will be same than during the classic race.

The start list for the **sprint finals** and the **sprint team race** will be uploaded to the WhatsApp group after the heats.

Reminder: Name changes for team Events have to be made in written form as soon as possible after the classic individuals / sprint heats.





In sprint, only Teams with 4 finalists are allowed to change one name after the final. Please use the provided form at the race office located at the finish area.

The same bibs are used for classic and sprint (individual and team) races.

Bibs are distributed at the race office near the finish line.

12. Closing of the course

The race course is closed each day **15 minutes** before the first forerunner starts and remains closed until 20 minutes after the last participant crosses the finish line. The closing is valid for the whole race course from start to finish.

13. Pre-start control

Pre-start control will be located next to the put-in points. Classic on the left bank next to the boat entrance (approx. 200m upstream of start line). Sprint on right bank next to the boat entrance.

All athletes **MUST** pass the pre-start control.






14. Start location Classic race

Pre-start control will be next to the way to the put-in points. Athletes who want to warm up on upper part can do but need to exit the river at the prestart control for checking.

15. Finish location: Classic & Sprint







PARKING

All cars must park at the official parking.

Pathway: Vehicles must enter at the bottom of the field and exit at the top of the field.



16. Start and finish procedure

Individual events

The boat will be held on the start and released from 0 after the countdown has finished. Athletes are responsible to get themselves to the starting positions.

Athletes must stay in the designated waiting areas (upstream eddies) until the athlete at the start leaves the starting position.

There will be a clock facing upstream showing the time.

There will be an acoustic signal at the start.

Athletes must strictly follow the starter's instruction, otherwise they might be disqualified for the race/run.

Athletes must start within 3 seconds of their start time.

Start procedure – team events

Classic: all boats will be held from the raft located river left.

Sprint: all boats will be held at the start eddy.


Moving backwards after the start signal is not allowed.

All boats must pass the beam line within 10 seconds from the start time ("0").






Classic team start

Finish procedure

The beam line will be indicated by banner.

Athletes must exit on river **right** and pass through the equipment control (located next to the boat exit).

Athletes must not leave the finish zone until dismissed by the equipment control judge once they are no longer needed for the equipment- or antidoping-control.

Boats must be stored at the parking. NO boats on the path next to the river. The athletes need to use the road to go back to the pre-start and warm up area.

17. Course approval

IMPORTANT: at the sprint venue no paddling is allowed on the channel on the left of the island during the whole competition (classic and sprint). Any athlete paddling down the left channel will be disqualified for the whole competition.

The course must be approved by a simple majority of the nations present at the team leader meeting.

18. Start interval

Individual events

Classic: 60 seconds

Sprint Heats: 45 seconds

Sprint Final: 90 seconds according to live streaming requirements

Team events

Classic: 120 seconds Sprint: 90 seconds

19. Results

20. Protests

The enquiry desk is in the finish area

Access to this area is limited to accredited Team Leaders only.

The protest fee is 75 euros.

The chief judge will review all the available information for the processing of the enquiry. Following the investigation of the enquiry, the decision becomes a matter of fact and therefore can't be protested further. An enquiry is considered only when submitted within 20 minutes for classic and 5 minutes for sprint race after the competitor's result is posted.

21. Equipment control

The devices for boat measuring will be prepared Monday and daily 1 hour before first start near the finish line.

It is open for self-control on Monday, 12.08.2024 from 10.00 to 14.00. and Tuesday 13.08.2024 from 10.00 to 12:00

There will be random post-race equipment control at the finish line.

Airbags must be fully inflated.

22. Doping control

Doping control station is located in the Kayak Club approx. 500m down the finish line

Athletes will be notified for doping control in the finish area.

ID or passport will be requested.

23. Award ceremonies
