PARACANOE – A BEGINNER’S GUIDE

Paralympic canoe is exactly like canoeing for able-bodied athletes, enabling those with physical impairments to enjoy the sport and compete at the highest level. Athletes with impairments to the lower body or trunk compete in an individual 200-metre sprint on a straight-line course.

Races are contested by two types of boat, kayak and va'a (which means 'small boat' in the Polynesian language). The kayak is propelled by a double-blade paddle, while the va'a is an outrigger canoe which has a second pontoon as a support float and is used with a single-blade paddle.

Paracanoe made its Paralympic debut in Rio in 2016, with six gold medal events. The va'a will be introduced in Tokyo.

Para canoeists use upper body strength to drive their boat through the water, combined with an efficient, dynamic and stable paddling technique.

Kayak

These boats are ideally shaped for forward motion at 5.2m long, a minimum of 50cm wide and with a minimum weight of 12kg. The paddles are approximately two metres long and have a water-scooping blade on both sides. Athletes use one paddle and advance by placing the blade in the water alternately on each side of the boat.

Va'a

New to the Paralympic Games, this boat is longer than a kayak at up to 7.3m and has a minimum weight of 13kg, its length giving it more forward force. An outrigger (float) is used on either the left or right side of the boat to maintain balance. Canoes fitted with an outrigger have long been deployed by Pacific Islanders, but their use in sport is new. The paddles used with va'as have a blade on one side only and propulsion is achieved by placing the paddle on one side of the boat. Particular skill is needed to keep moving straight.

Athletes can modify the seat of the canoe and the inside of the cockpit to suit their individual impairment. A range of devices are used to maintain posture and ensure the athlete is stable and secure within the boat, such as belts to fix the body into the seat.

Classification

Athletes are divided into three groups according to degree of impairment and activity limitation. The classes are **KL1** (athletes who have very limited trunk and no leg function and paddle with shoulders and arms only); **KL2** (athletes who are partially able to use their legs and trunk); and **KL3** (athletes have trunk and partial leg function. They are able to sit with their trunk bent forward in the kayak and are able to paddle by bracing their legs and using their hips).

THE VENUE – SEA FOREST WATERWAY

The paracanoe course was constructed on this waterfront site, which is also located close to central Tokyo. Following the 2020 Games, the course will be used for international rowing and canoe competitions, and will become one of the premier locations in Asia for water sports. The venue was also used for the canoe sprint and rowing competitions at the Tokyo Olympics.





TOKYO PARACANOE – AT A GLANCE

- This will be the second appearance of paracanoe at the Paralympics. The sport made its debut in Rio in 2016
- Men's and women's Va'a (VL2) and men's Va'a (VL3) will make its Paralympic debut. 12 men will contest the VL2, 11 women the VL2, and 13 men the VL3
- For the first time paracanoe will have an athlete on the IPC refugee team. Former Syrian Anas Al Khalifa will make his Games debut in Tokyo
- More than 90 athletes will compete in the Tokyo paracanoe programme, an increase from the 60 which competed in Rio.
- 29 countries will be represented at the Tokyo Paralympics. Six countries will make their Paralympics paracanoe debut – Belarus, India, Kazakhstan, Portugal, Uzbekistan and the Russian Olympic Committee.
- Five of the six gold medalists from Rio in 2016 will be back to defend their gold medals. Only Great Britain's Anne Dickens in the women's KL3 no longer competes

- The introduction of va'a will provide a handful of athletes the opportunity to create history by winning two medals at a single Games. Australia's Curtis McGrath is current world champion in both his KL and VL boats.
- Every paracanoe race is held over 200 metres
- Israel's Pascale Bercovitch, at 54-years-of-age, will be the oldest paracanoe competitor at the Tokyo Paralympics
- Hungary's Peter Pal Kiss, at 18, will be the youngest paracanoe competitor in Tokyo
- Great Britain's Jeanette Chippington will be appearing at her seventh Paralympics. She began her career as a swimmer at the 1988 Paralympics in Seoul
- Sweden's Helene Ripa will be making her fourth Paralympics appearance, but just her second in paracanoe. Ripa also competed in swimming at the 1992 Paralympics, and in cross-country skiing at the 2014 Winter Paralympics
- Chile's Robinson Mendez will be at his fifth Paralympics, but his first in paracanoe. His previous four Paralympics were as a wheelchair tennis player

MEN'S KL1 200

KISS, Peter Pal (HUN) – Reigning ICF world champion, the youngest Paracanoe competitor in Tokyo. Is also the reigning European champion.

FARIAS, Estaban (ITA) – World championship and European championship silver medalist behind Hungary's Kiss. Was world champion in 2017 and 2018.

Da SILVA, Luis Cardoso – Bronze medalist at the 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 world championships.

TOKARZ, Jakub (POL) – Gold medalist at the 2016 Paralympics.



WOMEN'S KL1 200

MAZHULA, Maryna (UKR) – World champion 2018 and 2019, reigning European champion. Has dominated in recent years.

CHIPPINGTON, Jeanette (GBR) – Gold medalist at the 2016 Paralympics, is lining up for her seventh Games.

MULLER, Edina (GER) – Gold medalist in women's wheelchair basketball at the London 2021 Paralympics, won paracanoe silver in Rio after becoming world champion in 2016. Silver medalist 2019 world championships.

MCGRATH, Curtis (AUS) – Unbeaten in major competitions since winning gold at the Rio Paralympics. World champion 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019. Will start red-hot favourite/

SWOBODA, Markus (AUT) – Silver medalist 2016 Paralympics. World championship silver medalist 2016/2017.
